We're moving ahead...

Ayb High School is the first social program in our non-state education sector. Over 75% of the students from Armenia, Artsakh and Diaspora that have been enrolled at Ayb High School receive scholarships from the Ayb Foundation, along with an opportunity for the best education compliant to 21st century standards. Within the scope of this eight-year-old project, the Foundation has transferred 897 full or partial scholarships.

Upon graduating from Ayb High School, the students continue their education at most celebrated universities in Armenia and abroad, joining the ranks of the "educational ambassadors" of our country to apply their knowledge for its development. The fundraising team is working toward the replenishment of Ayb High School Scholarship Fund, involving donations from individual benefactors and organizations, lest any student should be left out of education due to financial issues

In the 2017–2018 academic year, the Foundation has transferred a total of AMD122 361 309 84 to the High School.

The Russian Bear Cub Contest is considered the "younger brother" of the Kangaroo world-famous international contest. The Ayb Educational Foundation has been the exclusive organizer of the Russian Bear Cub—Linguistics for All Contest of the Russian Language since 2010, in Armenia, and since 2011, in Artsakh.

Meghu Contest of the Armenian Language

Based on the positive and long-standing experience of organizing the Kangaroo and Russian Bear Cub contests, the Ayb Foundation has established and held the Meghu Contest of the Armenian language in Armenia and Artsakh since 2014.

In 2018, Meghu was held for the fifth time; 35419 students of grades 3 to 12 from 969 schools of Armenia and Artsakh took part in the contest.

All-Armenian Tournament of Young Chemists

Since 2010, the Ayb Educational Foundation has been organizing the All-Armenian Tournament of Young Chemists for the students fond of chemistry. The contest is held in the format of an interactive game, where the students of 9-12 grades solve complex chemistry problems, debate around scientific topics and present the deliverables of their research. The tournament is unique in Armenia and would not have been possible without the large community of specialists and supporters; the input of the teams' teacher-coaches and the jury is also invaluable for us.







Number of children according to age groups, 2009–2018








The Araratian Baccalaureate Program was to be introduced in the high schools of Armenia and Artsakh starting from September 2018 on a free basis. For years, the Ayb Educational Foundation has spared no efforts to disseminate and expand the only internationally recognized Armenian–language educational program in the general educational institutions of Armenia and Artsakh, free of charge, to provide our children with the best future.

Sadly, the expansion of the program was suspended despite the fact that no violations had been documented in the result of the months-long financial and content examination (at least as of this moment, edit.)

Nevertheless, in October 2018, the Ayb Educational Foundation and the RA Ministry of Education and Science signed a memorandum of further cooperation within the framework of the AB Program, restating the willingness to make the program accessible in all Armenian high schools, preserve the integrity of the program and arrange the revision of the scope, resources and terms of program implementation.

About the Program

In 2014, the Ayb Educational Foundation, in cooperation with Cambridge Assessment International Education and Institute of Education at University College London, launched a wide-scale educational initiative, i.e. the National Program of Educational Excellence (NPEE), which aimed to create an internationally competitive educational program for Armenian schools — the Araratian Baccalaureate — and increase the importance of the teacher's role in society.

In December 2016, the RA Government adopted a decree to allow the incorporation of the Araratian Baccalaureate (AB) exams in RA state general educational institutions and recognized the AB exam results for admissions to Armenian universities.

"The Araratian Baccalaureate has a number of design aspects that are, I think, very cleverly done, and there has been a very clear vision of what the Ayb Foundation was trying to achieve with the program, and we have not deviated from that goal and we kept the project lean and efficient, which has allowed to achieve international recognition very quickly and to do it cost effectively, but still not compromise on the quality, and achieve high value."



On the one hand, it helps develop the abilities and skills of the Armenian specialists in compliance with international standards, to develop exams of new quality and depth; on the other hand, it ensured the local and international recognition of the AB certificate through clarity and transparency of the examination processes. All of it has been possible through the quidance of Cambridge Assessment International Education at Cambridge University and close cooperation with its education specialists. Though the program has been suspended, thanks to the efforts of the Ayb Community members and their direct investments, the Examination Center of the Araratian Baccalaureate continued its activities in the academic year of 2018-2019, enabling the students of Ayb High School to take the standard and advanced exams of the Araratian Baccalaureate in the Armenian language and to enroll, based on accrued results, in the renowned higher educational establishments in Armenia and abroad





Principally new methods and approaches have been contributed in the qualification program of the teachers within the Araratian Baccalaureate. The program has shaped a full ability to pursue my own learning, manage classroom time efficiently and see the individuality in each student. It has also provided multiple chances to bond with my profession even more.


■ Haykuhi Markosyan

In 2015–2018, AMD2 541 963.20 was allocated from the RA state budget to the Professional Teacher Development Program, which comprises around










In 2013, the Ayb Educational Foundation, in cooperation with the Central Bank of Republic of Armenia, opened Dilijan Central School in Dilijan town. It is part of Ayb school family and Ayb's first school project implemented by external order and via external financing. As a result of this joint cooperation, an urban school model was created, which was accessible not only for the children of the CBA's employees, but also other families residing in Dilijan. The conditions of study at the school are the same for all the students; the CBA covers the tuition for all the students.

Dilijan Central School is a basic school with its elementary and middle school components.

The creation and successful launch of Dilijan Central School was the first attempt of the Ayb Educational Foundation to disseminate the all-embracing educational platform of the Araratian Baccalaureate, which was developed and further elaborated within Ayb's educational projects.

On November 4, Dilijan Central School students took part in the second, i.e. community phase of the 13th chess tournament for the RA school students that was devoted to the 2800th anniversary of the foundation of Yerevan. Among the eight teams representing the community of Dilijan town, our team took the first place, to continue the battle further in the marz phase of the Olympiad in the spring of 2019.

On May 20, our 8th graders Emma Hovsepyan and Lilit Grigoryan took part in the National Poetry Recitation Finals at the American University of Armenia. About 60 gifted students from all over Armenia took part in the contest this year. Our students impressed the audience with their unique skills and had a chance to enjoy English poetry recitals by other participants.

It's been several years since our students started participating in the Russian Bear Cub contest and displaying excellent results due to their profound knowledge! Our sixth grader Robert Beglaryan is a recordsman; he has been winning in the contest for four years in a row now, increasing his score every year!

Within the scope of a science class, the 3rd graders held an experiment on "the impact of carbonated drinks on a human organism." The experiment aimed to find out the type of influence a carbonated drink might have on one's teeth. The results of the conducted experiments convinced the students of this harmful influence.

Well, we'll tell you right away that they're the winners of the Meghu 2018 contest among the 7th-8th graders for the Best Result category! The girls are Sofi, Anghela and Lili who take a great pleasure in participating in the Meghu: Armenian for Everyone contest every year. The contest is popular for its engaging tasks, and the girls had expectations to win some prizes this year as well!





The Events of the Year

On Feburary 16, Dilijan Central School accomplished an important initiative for the school and the community: an interschool programming contest dedicated to Ashot Hovhannisyan was held for the first time. We are pleased to announce that from now on, the tournament will be held on an annual basis.

The open lesson on the "use of chemistry in art" for the ninth graders and all the attendees became a unique opportunity for fascinating revelations. The art teachers listed the chemical processes applied in jewelry art, particularly in copper jewelry making, as well as etching (also called "eau-forte"), a technique of graphics. The pace of the class was dynamic, determined by the great interest toward the conducted experiments.

Anghela and Lili are 6th graders in DCS. The homework on idioms for the Armenian language class had inspired them so much that they decided to do it together right at the school. Armed with pencils, pens and dictionaries, they spread out the papers and decided to sort out the idioms with the word "heart," find their meanings and illustrate them, making the pictures as fun and creative as possible.

We accomplished the family project "My Genealogical Tree," which aimed at providing kids with another opportunity to meet their grandparents, talk with them, learn about themselves and value selfcognition. Eight winners in three categories were identified at the end of the event.

Bun Barekendan, Palm Sunday, Easter and Annunciation were celebrated with a staged information, song and dance program. Cheerful games and art and craft lessons were organized, much to everyone's excitement and interest, so it was no surprise everyone was so content that they even felt a little upset to be leaving and parting at the end, despite taking away with them the good mood of the day and the self-made souvenirs and jewelry.

The 6th Ayb Games are history now, adding yet another page to the DCS chronicles. As in the previous years, the representatives of our school community, i.e. students, parents and teachers, had an active participation in Ayb Games this year. The oath-taking ceremony of the new students and teachers was followed by an active entertainment program that left nobody uninvolved.

Ayb Mentorship Program; the Community Passes Down Its Values

The mission of Ayb Mentorship Program is to create a system of mutual assistance for the generations, contributing to the transfer of the basic values and to the students' personal and professional development.

All graduates of Ayb High School are mentees under the Mentorship Program, from the moment of graduation till they are 25 years old. The initiators and followers of the Ayb movement are mentors within this Program scope; they lend a helping hand to the younger generation, contributing to the latter's self-actualization with their personal example, experience and activity.

Meetings with Mentors

In the academic year of 2018-2019, our students and graduates:







met with Arsen Galstyan and his guests Mikhail and Maria Yugay to discuss the current demand in new professions and knowledge; discussed and piloted new approaches and principles of efficient communication and creative problem solutions with Suren Harutyunyan;








Scholarships for Students at World's Top Universities



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Independent Auditors' Report

To the Board of Trustees of Ayb Educational Foundation

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Ayb Educational Foundation (the "Foundation"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2018, the statements of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, changes in fund balance and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes, comprising significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Foundation as at 31 December 2018, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Foundation in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the Republic of Armenia, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with IFRS, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Foundation or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Foundation's financial reporting process.



Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Foundation's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditors' report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditors' report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Foundation to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

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

Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees is the supreme governing body of the Ayb Educational Foundation. Its term of office is two years.

The year of 2018 was that of amendments and reorganizations. The chain of amendments started with systemic and structural changes at the Ayb Educational Foundation, as a result of which departments were established to comply with the authentic functions and objectives, and staff was redacted in some departments (conditioned by the termination of the NPEE).

The amendments touched the management structure of the Foundation as well, within the scope of which the Ayb Club took a decision to dissolve itself with 26 votes in favor. Out of the 36 Club members, 28 took part in the voting. In compliance with the procedures set forth by the charter of the Club, the decision on self-dissolution may be taken by a minimum of 2/3 of the total votes, i.e. 24 votes. In the event of self-dissolution of the Ayb Club, the function to ensure the continuity of Ayb's mission shall be reserved to the Board of Trustees of the Ayb Educational Foundation, which the latter has fully assumed.

The majority of the former Ayb Club members are still united around the Ayb idea and continue to invest their potential and experience in education transformation and development in Armenia and Artsakh.

The Ayb Educational Foundation holds in high regard the efforts, enthusiasm, trust and faith invested by each benefactor and each devotee throughout the 13 years of Ayb's existence.





The vast majority of these projects have been created and implemented by the two schools of Ayb family, i.e. Ayb High School and Dilijan Central School, and some components of these projects were included in the Araratian Baccalaureate Program.

Ayb aspires to share and disseminate any achievement and new opportunity to create a broad cooperation platform for the sake of reforms in the educational system.

The new directions of our activities fully serve this purpose. The Ayb Educational Foundation has already launched its new-format cooperation with various marz schools of the Republic, including the Memorandum of Cooperation signed with Tavush Municipality on the implementation of joint educational projects, and other agreements reached.



One of our largest projects is the creation of AybLabs.

The project aims to provide schools with technologically equipped natural science laboratories and such learning environments where students would have the opportunity to reveal their potential, conduct experiments, come up with small discoveries and lay the foundation for their future success. At the same time, the Foundation has initiated a qualification training phase for the teachers involved in the program, which would create a platform for horizontal cooperation not only for the trained teachers but also the schools via bringing them together around projects of common interest. This is a model that would, in our opinion, embrace the whole cooperative cycle and ensure the dissemination of laboratory skills.

There are already 11 AybLabs in various marzes and schools of the Republic, 3 out of which belong to Ayb family schools, and 8 are located in Yerevan, Qajaran, Vagharshapat and Berd. These are complete laboratory complexes with their spatial solutions, furnishing and equipment, communication and security systems.



The project will enable new opportunities for the learners and teachers, create principally new educational resources in the Armenian language, in line with and in addition to the educational programs, as well as develop the idea of online education. At the same time, Armenia will be actively

involved in the development of online educational resources. In a three-year perspective, creation of materials in the Armenian language, particularly in the section of natural sciences, has been planned, which will contribute to the knowledge and professional skills of the learners and







teachers involved in the AybLabs, making the latest achievements and learning materials of subjects accessible for them. In other words, the knowledge attained through Khan will be applied in practice at AybLabs, as a shortcut to the discovery and love of science.

We also envisage content development on the basis of the accrued experience. Khan Academy will have sections for the Armenian language, culture and history and will offer new engaging and authentic materials to the platform users.



The Ayb Educational Foundation creates a platform for horizontal cooperation among schools and in new areas as well,

aiming at revealing and disseminating the best educational practices and culture. Within the scope of the Araratian Baccalaureate, the successfully launched and inspirational teacher training will also continue. All of the above mentioned will be pursued in new cooperation formats and platforms, involving more partners, via uniting efforts and creating a larger synergistic impact for systemic reforms.
