



You're the Cover!



The dictionary states etiquette is the customary code of polite behavior in society or among members of a particular profession or group.

Etiquette is extremely important in the publishing industry. We all know, or should know, stepping on toes, along with cheating, attacking readers/authors, behaving in any cutthroat manner, or negative behavior in a professional environment is unacceptable. Too many authors don't care, and have the attitude of tough turkey.

Here's the thing. The people

around you have the same right to do things their way, just as you have the right to do things your way. Getting along with your fellow industry professionals shows merit.

The book industry is a multi-billion dollar industry and you are a part of it. Your actions reflect on everyone around you, whether it be face to face at a convention, library, book signing, or social media.

Decorum:

Decorum is one of the keys of success. Stand out as the go-to author, and take advantage of some of the rules of etiquette. It will help you be notable in a positive way.

I'm not referring to old school, don't chew gum, don't drink alcohol, and don't show your ankles...

Some people may think the use of etiquette is outdated. It isn't. Society may have slackened its rules, and it's not as strict as it used to be years ago, but it is still very important.

No one's going to freak if you don't put your napkin on your lap, or your hair is out-of-place, or even if it's purple, orange, and blue.

Respect:

Etiquette requires treating those around you with respect.

I'll give an example. Several years ago, I was at a book event. The author next to me was speaking with another author at her table. She'd dropped the F-bomb a couple of times, and was being a bit crass.

No big deal to me, I personally don't care.

You may be saying, who cares?
The interested reader at her table did. She frowned, put the book down, took her young daughter's hand, and walked away.

A lost sale, all because the author wasn't 'reading the room'.

Protocol:

Protocol is just another word for etiquette.

When arriving at an event, you should find the hostess and thank her for including you. You may stop and acknowledge people as you search her out, but it's considerate and customary to acknowledge her. Let her know how appreciative you are for being included in the event. Especially if it's a small limited event. For example, if it's a librarian allowing you to do a book signing at her library, buy her a small



gift, and send her a hand-written thank you card.

Yes, thank you cards are appreciated.

However, there are ways to avoid unintentionally offending someone or causing issues.

For example, introducing people in the proper order.

What? There's a proper order? Absolutely.

Let me give you an example: You're at an important lun-

cheon. A graphics designer, a couple of authors, and the hostess are sitting at your table. An author you personally know approaches the table. Whom do you introduce first?

If you chose the hostess, you're correct. Then you go around the table in order from the right side of the hostess. Archaic? Perhaps, but no one will feel insulted.

Not sure where to start? Start on your left and go around the table.

Is someone else making the introductions? Stand and shake their hand when being introduced. (Unless,

of course, you aren't physically capable.) At a large gathering where there's introductions and it's not a reception line, murmur hello and niceties.

We all know how to be polite. This is the time to show it off on how awesome you can be. Please, thank you, you're welcome, or pardon me go a long way.

Consideration:

Etiquette also includes being considerate of those around you. There are more than enough readers in the world. There's no need to feel threatened by another author's success.

You've heard the expression *paying it forward.* It is also important to *return the favor*. Helping goes both ways.

Always.

An author does you a favor by promoting your book, mentioning it on their blog, etc. Besides thanking them, return the favor. If the author says, don't worry about it—pay it forward and help someone else.

Many authors have blogs, are you having trouble keeping it active? Share other author's cover reveals, launches, and anything else to help them. Put your focus on the reader and they will see it's not all about you.

Dress for Success:

Wearing clothing that is proper for the occasion helps put your best foot forward. Remember, especially at a convention, you are on from the moment you walk into the hotel to check in.

Old t-shirts and stained shorts are no-no's.

You want people to take you seriously as a professional. You want members of the publishing industry to know you believe your position is important to you and them. Your readers want to meet you, and read your books.

There's no need to spend hundreds of dollars on designer clothing. You can wear dollar store clothing. It doesn't matter. No one is going to look at your tags. You can still be comfortable and casually dressed, as long as



Let me give you a nightmarish example. Husband and I were searching to purchase a rental property. We made arrangements and an appointment with an agent to show us the house.

The next morning we waited for her at the house we were interested in purchasing.

She arrived late, in a pair of dirty, baggy shorts that looked like they belonged to her husband, and a stained, frayed t-shirt.

Um, no. We weren't about to do business with her. To us, it was obvious she didn't care. She may have, but she didn't look like it and she didn't act like it.

Appearances are important. People subconsciously see things concerning day-to-day actions. We're visual.

Readers are visual.

Punctuality:

Punctuality is a priority. If you're late, it means the event wasn't

important enough for you. (Unless it's out of your control. Spit happens.)

In my opinion, the agent made two grievous mistakes. She was late, and she didn't dress or behave like a professional.

Use etiquette as a part of the creation of the professional you. People do judge a book by its cover.

You are the cover:

First impressions are important.

They see you, and if they like what they see, they'll approach you. It's similar to them looking at the back of the cover. You've gotten their attention, now don't mess it up when you open your mouth.

Whatever do you mean?

Frown at those words all you want but we must retain our professionalism, whether it's on social media, or in person.

Be considerate, be polite, be respectful, and listen to them. Treat them as an equal or better, and greet them with a smile.

That's right better. You're not a queen/king. Without the reader,

and other industry professionals you wouldn't be where you are as an author. If it weren't for their interest in you and your books, they wouldn't be following you on Facebook, Twitter, or any other social media sites.

They wouldn't be standing in front of your table wanting to purchase your books.

They are precious to you and you need to treat them that way.

Authors who personally know each other swear around each other, tell raunchy jokes, talk about sex scenes, etc. They're comfortable and relaxed and 99 % of the time, no one else is around.

Don't curse around other members of the industry you don't know. It's unprofessional. Especially, don't swear around readers, even if they've been a loyal fan for years.

Stand out. Don't stick out.

A little comparison for you to understand why I say you're the cover.

Creating a book cover that sells your book is the number one priority in

Rebecca peered out her window. Two men were struggling with a third man. "I have no idea. Whatever they're up to, I imagine it's the reason we haven't left the station yet."








An Interview with Cover Model Keith Manecke

Today I'm excited to be chatting with cover model Keith Manecke.

Debra: Keith, what was the first cover you appeared on, and how did this come about?

Keith: The first cover I appeared on and released was *Illusion* on Ice by SR Grey. In 2018, I was approached by Chris of CJC Photography. I was new to the modeling scene, brand new in fact, and he explained his work and the possibility that I could be on a book cover. After the shoot, SR Grey and LA Cotton both found images that they wanted for their respective upcoming books. Although Cotton purchased her image first, it was Greys' book that made the initial publication in May of 2019.

Debra: If you could do a photo shoot anywhere in the world for a cover, where would you most want to go? What sort of shoot would it be?

Keith: Modeling has allowed me to travel to places I never would have gone to and I am very appreciative of that. It has also changed my mindset and even if I'm traveling and not technically working, I still want to create an amazing image with the given scenery. In terms of a book cover, I would want to do the same thing and create a beautiful work of art in one of the amazing natural wonders of the world. The Amazon rainforest, Mount Fuji, Machu Picchu, the list is almost endless. With all the great beauties in the world, it's hard to pick just one, I would be happy to grace the cover of a novel with many of the great backdrops in this world.

Debra: Any one of those places would make for an amazing cover. Perhaps an author will see the places you've listed

and set a book there! Beyond romance novel cover shots, what other projects or jobs keep you busy?

Keith: I am involved in all types of modeling, and I love it. The list ranges from bridal shoots, infomercials, music videos, e-comm shoots, runway walks, commercials, and even the occasional guest bartending gig for parties. I love staying busy and encompassing all that the modeling world has to offer.

Debra: What's one question you wish an interviewer would ask you?

Keith: Honestly, I never have any expectations from an interviewer ha-ha. I'm always curious about what they want to know and wonder if I am as interesting as they think I will be. I tend to answer questions more straightforwardly, so I need to work on adding a bit more pizazz and flair!

Debra: You are interesting just as you are, so be yourself, no added flair needed. If you wrote a book, what would it be about?

Keith: I'm more of a nonfiction reader so the only book I've ever seriously considered writing would be a memoir. I've read some great ones in the past (Shoe Dog by Phil Knight was written extremely well and I am impressed with the effort that went into him recalling all his life events) and I would want to make sure that I took my time and truly wrote it to the best of my ability.

Debra: I hope you write that book one day and I look forward to reading it. Now I ask this question in interviews because your fitness level is beyond the average person. What is your exercise routine and what sort of nutrition plan do you follow to achieve and maintain your level of fitness? Keith: I have my Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Exercise Science. I started caring about my health in high school so I could excel as much as I could on the basketball court. I took that interest and made it my major and love what I learned. I think the foundation of sports followed by my schooling really gave me the tools I needed to succeed. I try to stay active constantly, I hate sitting and incorporate a healthy lifestyle by eating right and moving more. In simplistic terms that's all it is. My current fitness regime is as follows: basketball league on Monday, upper body workout on Tuesday, leg work out on Wednesday morning and beach volleyball on Wednesday night, another upper body workout on either Thursday or Friday (depending on my schedule), pickup basketball on Saturday morning, yoga once a week, and a rest day on Sunday. I also walk my dog about 1.5-2 miles every morning and every night.

My diet consists of a lot of lean proteins, veggies, fruits, and nuts. I try not to eat too many carbs. Although they are definitely important, I know how easy it can be to overindulge. I'm still a human and enjoy pizza and will go out for wings and drinks with my friends, but I try to be smart and don't miss a workout the following day. There are always excuses to not eat right or to not exercise. I know how life can be and try to negate those excuses before they can happen. Even this morning I did hot yoga before my 9 a.m. shoot because I was up and thought that was a better use of my time than just sitting on my phone.

Debra: If you could share three simple fitness tips, the av-



erage romance reader could do every day to stay healthy, what would they be?

Keith: The big key here is to get into a habit that's doable. The best diet and/or workout program in the world doesn't mean jack if you don't go through with it. I'm bad at generalizing, I like to take each individual for who they are, but for the sake of this interview, I'll give it a shot:

Find an activity you like doing, going for a walk/run, playing a sport, weightlifting, etc. Sometimes the comradery can help, and it becomes a fun social time as well.

Eat foods that are closer to their natural state. Oranges instead of orange juice or orange drink, peanuts and dark chocolate instead of Reese's, even just whole meat and potatoes instead of deli meat and white bread are all great steps to take. It doesn't have to be tricky, just less processing and more realization of what it is that you're actually eating.

The third step would be to watch/limit the liquids you have. I'm not talking about water but the sodas and alcohol choices. Even going from six Cokes a day to four is an improvement, same with alcohol. Americans do not have the best diets and in general,

these are some steps that I think could help millions of Americans live healthier lives.

Debra: Excellent advice. Now it's your birthday dinner and the calories don't count. What's on the menu and what are you drinking?

Keith: Do calories ever count on a birthday? Ha-ha. There are always reasons to eat poorly and drink, but I'll play along;) Honestly, I absolutely love pizza and sushi and would (and have) eaten copious amounts of both. Washing it down smoothly with craft beer and old fashions. I love food so much that if I didn't work out or have any discipline, I would weigh a hell of a lot more than I do now!

Debra: Describe the perfect romantic evening:

Keith: To have a romantic evening be truly perfect, it would have to be something that the girl would want to do so it is very subjective to her. I'd want to take her on a fun adventure first, followed by a dinner with an amazing view, possibly the sunset after (living in Florida I'm prone to gorgeous sunsets). I admit that there is a lot of wiggle room in these statements, but they are up for

interpretation. This could be done in Italy, Tokyo, a rooftop in New York, so many amazing options. I'm envisioning two well-dressed individuals, candlelight, and the sweet smile on her face that les me know she's truly happy.

Debra: She would be one lucky girl. Please share one unusual fact about vou or vour life:

Keith: I came from a very small town in Wisconsin. The hometown vibes made me who I am, and I like that (a lot of people think I'm from a city). I was a Green Bay Packers cheerleader in college, and I can't swim. I know that's more than one, but, oh well, ha-ha.

Debra: More than one is even more fun. Now eight Quickie questions: Watching the sunrise or watching the sunset and the stars?

Keith: Sunset.

Debra: The beach or the mountains?

Keith: MMM Beach.

Debra: Primitive camping or luxury hotel?

Keith: Depends on my mood, but I'd say a luxury hotel.



USA Today Best-Selling Author Nia Farrell is a four-time Golden Flogger Finalist, a founding member of the Wicked Pens, and author or co-author of four titles voted The 50 Best Indie Books of the Year. Nia writes contemporary and historical romance as Nia Farrell, historical romance as Erinn Ellender Quinn, sizzling romantic comedy as Ree L. Diehl, and Young Adult as Grace Cafferty. Regardless of genres, ultimately, her books are about the healing power of love. She was blessed to share fifty-one years with the love of her life before losing him to cancer in 2024.

AdC: Tell us about the genre(s) you write and the type of characters you love to write about.

N.F.: I write a wide range of genres historical, contemporary, dystopian, sci-fi, fantasy, shifters, MC, MM, MMF/MFM menages, BDSM, sports... the list goes on. My favorite stories are MMF menages where the relationship between the men is as important as their relationship with the woman they share. I find the psychology of BDSM fascinating and enjoy writing dominant Alpha males and strong women who are submissive by choice. Many of my characters are survivors whose journey toward healing is woven into the fabric of the story. When I'm writing, I just follow the threads.

AdC: Do you have a new book or series?

NF: Claire Marta and I are currently editing *Hell's Fury MC: Emerson* (Guarded Hearts Order of the Dragon Book 7) and writing a Fae Academy novel, the first book in a YA series written under our new YA pen names, Anna Sinclaire and Grace Cafferty.

AdC: Which tasks/projects do you find you tend to procrastinate on and why?

N.F. My writing has been on hold the past months due to my husband's health. I lost him in September, six days after our fifty-first anniversary. I'm looking forward to finding my new "normal" and diving back into writing.

AdC: If you had to pick any character in one of your books, who is most similar to you, who would you choose? Why?

N.F. Grace Murphy from my "Three Graces" series is the most like me, from her red hair and Irish blood to her sixth sense and her belief in soulmates who share multiple lifetimes. Like Grace, I'm a healer by nature.

AdC: If you were transported to the setting of the book you're currently reading or writing, where would you be?

N.F. I'd be at Wildwood Fae Academy in alternate reality Northern Ireland.

Zara Doyle's *Tori and her Wolf* explores the fated-mate bond between werewolves Tori and Hunter. After a less than positive first impression on Hunter, Tori believes he'll reject her. To


avoid the brutal pain of mate rejection, she flees. Mechanical engineer Tori lands her dream job and moves to New York. She enters her building's gym and encounters Hunter. He's the CEO, owner, and her boss. She's not only freaked out about rejection but also being fired. Rich, handsome, arrogant, rude, and frightening, Hunter is a werewolf who can have anyone he wants. Why would he choose Tori?

Doyle's vivid, descriptive and intriguing opening draws readers in. However, the author fails to provide context for Tori's fear of rejection and subsequent behavior so it doesn't work narratively. However, Doyle delves into their mate relationship so quickly it hurts the story. Giving them time to get to know one another better before starting an intimate relationship would have felt more organic. They go from zero to 60.

While we get to know Tori fairly well, we learn little about Hunter's background—hearing only his apology, explanation, and declaration of feelings. Although he takes responsibility for his mistakes and caring for Tori and her brother, it's difficult to say we know him. Hunter and Tori share sweet and funny interactions, and their sexual tension is palpable and intense before they explore their bond. However, their love scenes feel awkward and it's difficult to connect with their relationship.

Tori's an unreliable narrator. Because it's written in Tori's first-person POV, we have only her limited perspective of events and thoughts or beliefs about what Hunter thinks and feels about her. Her confusion over her feelings of attraction to Hunter is overwhelming, and colors all her thoughts, making it difficult for her to think rationally. This heightens all the mistaken ideas, self-esteem issues, and mistaken communication that occurs. It becomes frustrating eventually because the story goes nowhere.



When Jane retreats to a cabin in the country, it happens that her only neighbor is a teenage girl with a reclusive mother. Hen Vogel is an avid Lightning Bottles fan with a secret. Years before, she happened to witness an argument between Jane and Elijah. When Jane crumpled a paper with Elijah's artwork, Hen retrieved it from the trash. By coincidence she happened upon some graffiti in Berlin that matched the drawing style of Elijah's cartoon which convinced her he was still alive and leaving clues to help someone find him.

On the eve of her wedding at a bachelorette party, Erin planned to surprise her fiancé Shauna Hunnicut with their dream trip to Hawaii for their honeymoon. She financed the trip because she had sold one of her paintings. She left her friends drinking and dancing in the club and slipped into a private room where she planned to dress in a grass skirt to present the surprise tickets to Shauna. Instead, she was brutally attacked from behind and left for dead while her friends partied on, oblivious to her plight.

Eve Dallas had her work cut out for her, since no one noticed anyone suspicious in the club, and because of the nature of the establishment, the owner shunned security cameras. Younger readers will enjoy the creepy-crawly, completely relatable type of horror with some humor thrown in. Remy Lai makes some interesting choices that keeps this story from being predictable, and it only adds to the fun.

Though short, the pacing is good, leading to an ending that is surprising, but satisfying. Hannah is spunky and likable without being unrealistically perfect as she tries to figure out how to save herself without putting loved ones and those around her at risk. Avery is excited to go back to her small hometown to spend time with her friends for a summer visit. Her parents moved her to Philadelphia and she hates it there, mostly because she had to leave her best friend Paige behind. However, things have changed. Paige is so different now, more into things that Avery doesn't like, such as wearing makeup, hanging out with Avery's former bully; and her two buddies Jaylen and Tyler who fight constantly. The group seems to have grown apart. Avery gets the idea of doing a seance at the local closed, supposedly haunted, theater as a bid to bring everyone together. When things start to go wrong and the quartet gets trapped in the theater, they realize there is a dark presence there that doesn't want them to leave alive.

This is a book about growing up and facing fears and change. Avery is fixated on the past and things being like they used to be. Her anxiety keeps her from taking chances, such as making new friends and trying different hobbies, putting herself out there. She is distressed at how much her friends have changed and doesn't understand why Paige is making the choices she's made. Through their harrowing ordeal in the haunted theater, Avery learns to face her fears and conquer her insecurities.

Avid adult readers of middle grade books may be disappointed at how young the books read initially. Avery acts more childish than she should for this story, and the contrast between her and the overall tone of the book was jarring. This makes the narrative a bit harder to get into. But as the story progresses, the eerie, intriguing tone draws in the reader.

There are some genuinely spooky and unnerving parts that take this book to the next level. While it still feels a little simplistic in the way the characters are written, the horror delivers. The origins of the haunting and the sinister events in the theater were very interesting, and made this a more satisfying read. Underlying the narrative are good lessons about maturity and growth that readers may appreciate. Stage Fright has some good qualities that make it a fun, scary book for younger middle grade readers.

He understands exactly how to deal with unquiet spirits. But there seems to be an unusual amount of activity lately. Soon, Oscar comes to realize that they may be related to his own origins.

The Strange Tales of Oscar Zahn, Volume 1 is a must read for fans of occult detective stories with a unique twist. While this feels unique, it also favorably evokes memories of Mike Mignola's iconic "Hellboy" series. This is a volume full of episodic adventures that also tie into a greater, ongoing narrative. It has an alluring mix of dark fantasy, folklore, gothic horror and cosmic horror, with a smattering of science fiction. Both spooky and mysterious, there's a lot to pay attention to in the panels, which are beautifully illustrated, relying on the artwork to communicate the ideas as

much, if not more, than dialogue. Readers should not be surprised if they don't always get answers or understand exactly what unfolds in the stories. The sense of the unknown does add to the overall mood: intriguing and uncanny, leaving readers eager for more adventures with Oscar Zahn and his assistant Agnes.

Can Sherry work with her small circle of friends, including the new, young, handsome priest, a newly widowed, cosmopolitan art gallery owner, and her skeptic therapist friend to figure out what exactly is plaguing their town?

This book is tailor-made for fans of cozy mysteries mixed with episodic, ensemble paranormal tv shows. There's something very innovative about the feel of this story. While aspects feel familiar to fans of genre fiction in this niche, the execution feels very fresh. The pace is very leisurely, but things progress nicely towards the conclusion. The cast of potential suspects is diverse-with murky pasts and motives that make them quite morally questionable-bringing to mind British mystery and crime shows. into the overall story, as her compulsion to solve crimes relates to past trauma. When the demonic angle comes in, it makes for some well-written and nicely spooky scenes to remind readers that something very unnatural is going on in this town and with this situation. 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Horror movie buffs will often play the guessing game of who's going to survive until the end of the movie, and often it's not the person who looks or identifies like themselves. In this collection of stories, that's flipped on its head. Because, across the wide variety of these spooky tales, "the white guy dies first."

In this volume, thirteen authors explore the dimensions of fear, terror, and horror, along with the concept of identity (from the concept of race, ethnicity, gender, and sexuality) and how that often places people into the category of "other," with a feeling of isolation and a lack of safety that causes a kind of existential terror in and of itself. The authors don't hold back on the horror, scary imagery, disturbing subject matter, and gore while bucking the trend of choosing marginalized people to victimize first in horror stories. This volume is for older teen horror buffs, who love a good scare and aren't traumatized by stories with visceral imagery and a pervasive sense of dread that will keep them on the edge of their seat. If there's a horror movie category out there, there's a story in this collection to scratch that itch. It's definitely worth reading.


keep her from being who she wanted to be, is Hayden. He would do anything for her.
