Make Sure Every Kid in Every Neighborhood Can Succeed

When schools shut down, the teachers unions still got paid but our kids bore the costs. "Virtual learning" has led to severe learning losses that will take years for our kids to make up. When parents wanted their voices heard, they weren't just ignored, they were targeted by the Biden administration.

- **Overall confidence in public schools is now at just 28%**
- **Nearly half (46%) of California respondents** with school-aged children say their youngest school-aged child has fallen behind academically during the pandemic
- **The Justice Department targeted parents** after an activist group labeled them "domestic terrorists"

Better Care and Improved Health Outcomes for All Americans

America is home to the best medical care in the world thanks to innovative treatments and cures. But Democrats seek to undermine our position as a world leader by imposing a top-down, one-size-fits-all government approach from Washington that will only lead to rationed care and worse services.

- **Democrat Socialist drug takeover** could lead to 135 fewer drugs and cures
- **Health insurance inflation** has increased premiums by 17% over the past year

1 Listen to Parents and Students

- Have a discussion about the importance of school choice - and find testimonies about how the right environment can set a child on a path to success. Always give children a seat at the table
- Host a town hall with parents to highlight the “Parents Bill of Rights” and to give them a platform to raise their concerns
- Visit a school in your community to learn about other opportunities for parents to be empowered



2 Encourage Young Athletes

- Meet with female athletes in your community who have had to compete against biological males to hear about the unfairness of this disadvantage
- Coordinate an event to empower both male and female athletes and highlight the importance of being active and contributing to a team
- In front of an audience comprised of female athletes and advocates of women’s sports, House Republicans held a roundtable discussion on the 50th anniversary of Title IX. The event was followed by a press conference. Select participants were asked to re-share their stories for the press



3 Reassure Families and Patients

- Host a conversation with medical professionals in your community about the importance of giving patients choices when it comes to their healthcare
- Speak with families who can attest to the power of life-saving medicines, and the importance of putting patients first, instead of the government
