



### 132698: Halloween Banner Simply Created Accessory Kit

Dress up your Simply Created Banner for Halloween! This kit has what you need to transform your Simply Created Banner from basic to boo-tiful in minutes.

#### Here's what you get:

- 4 strips of printed, scored paper for making rosettes, 2 each 2 designs (finished rosette size: 4" | 10.2 cm diameter)
- 4 printed printed, die-cut circles for rosette centers, 2 each of 2 designs (size: 2" | 5.1 cm)
- 3 glittered die-cut accents (sizes: 2-1/2", 4", 4-1/8" | 6.4 cm, 10.2 cm, 10.5 cm)
- 2 18" (45.7 cm) pieces of Basic Black 1/8" (3.2 mm) Taffeta Ribbon
- 2 18" (45.7 cm) pieces of Basic Black/Basic Gray 1/2" (1.3 cm) Striped Satin Ribbon
- 1 36" (91.4 cm) piece of Pumpkin Pie 1/2" (1.3 cm) Seam Binding Ribbon
- 5 Black Vintage Faceted Designer Buttons
- 5 Summer Starfruit Designer Buttons

#### COORDINATING COLORS:

- Basic Black
- Pumpkin Pie
- Summer Starfruit
- Very Vanilla

You'll need to provide some additional products to complete the banner:

- Adhesives. We recommend hot glue. You can use spray adhesive to hold the stencils in place, but it's optional.
- Well-inked Classic Stampin' Pads. We used Basic Black, Pumpkin Pie, and Summer Starfruit.
- Sponges. Sponge Daubers or Stampin' Sponges work well.

#### Step 1: Sponge the pennants

**Backgrounds** Note: The "p" pennant doesn't have a stenciled background.

"S", second "O," and "Y" pennants:

1. Line up the bottom of the stencil with the bottom of the pennant.
2. Sponge the design onto the pennant. Use Pumpkin Pie ink on the "s" and "y" pennants, and Summer Starfruit ink on the "o" pennant.

First "O" pennant:

1. Place the polka-dot stencil on the notched pennant and sponge five full rows of dots in Basic Black ink just below the grommets.

"K" pennant

1. Line up the circle stencil on the rounded pennant with the circle about 1/2" from the top of the pennant.
2. Using Summer Starfruit ink, sponge the circle onto the pennant.

#### Letters

Sponge each letter in Basic Black ink on the appropriate pennant.

#### Tips:

- Use a light spritz of spray adhesive on the back of the stencil and then place it on the pennant. Daub or rub the sponge on the pennant.
- Sponge all of the backgrounds first. There will be a blank circle at the top of some pennants (where the stencil is solid), but you'll cover those with a rosette. Sponge the backgrounds first, then the letters.
- It will be easier to keep letters aligned if you sponge letters that extend above or below the normal letter baseline, such as "p" or "k", on rounded and pointed pennants.

#### Step 2: Make the rosettes

1. Accordion-fold the paper strip and hot glue the ends together to create a circle.
2. Squeeze the circle together so it forms a cylinder, then gently push down until it flattens into a rosette. Hot glue the center together. Hold in place until the glue is dry.

#### Step 3: Cut the ribbon

1. Cut the Pumpkin Pie ribbon into a 14" piece and cut the rest in three pieces.
2. Cut the remaining ribbons in half.

You'll use one piece of Basic Black ribbon and the 14" Pumpkin Pie ribbon on the second "o" pennant. You'll tie the other pieces on the jute twine.

#### Step 4: Assemble the pennants

Tip: For the "o" pennant, fold the 14" piece of Pumpkin Pie ribbon back and forth three times (so you have a loop and a tail on each end).

Assemble the pennants as shown in the photo.

String the jute twine through the pennants. Tie ribbon around the jute twine and trim the tails.
