Overview of Moving Ahead For Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21)

Establishes National Transportation Goals

- Safety: reduction in fatalities and injuries
- Infrastructure Condition: state of good repair
- Congestion Reduction: significantly reduce traffic congestion
- System Reliability: improve efficiency
- Freight Movement and Economic Vitality: improve freight network, strengthen access of rural areas to markets, and support regional economic development
- Environmental Sustainability: enhance transportation while protecting and enhancing the natural environment
- Reduced Project Delivery Delays: eliminate delays in the project development and delivery process

Creates Performance-Based Planning Approach

USDOT to establish measures for:

- condition of pavements and bridges on the Interstate and national highway systems
- performance on Interstate and National Highway System
- serious injuries and fatalities
- traffic congestion
- on-road mobile emissions
- freight movement on the interstate system
- transit state of good repair
- transit safety

States must adopt performance targets in each of the highway areas and report progress.

Transit agencies must adopt performance targets for state of good repair and safety

Consolidates/Focuses National Transportation Programs

Five key highway programs:

- National Highway Performance Program
- Surface Transportation Program
- Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program
- Highway Safety Improvement Program
- Transportation Alternatives

Separate Bridge Program eliminated

Transportation Enhancements, Recreational Trails, and Safe Routes to Schools combined in a new, smaller Transportation Alternatives Program.

Three separate special needs transit programs consolidated into one

Streamlines Project Approval

Includes provisions to speed up development for smaller scale projects and to expedite review of projects
