



SINGRAULI Clerk arrested while taking bribe

Lokayukta police arrested an employee of a cluster of schools at Jayant in Singrauli on Friday when he was taking a bribe of Rs 2,500. According to reports, a teacher of a higher secondary school in Itwa, Umakant Verma, complained to the Lokayukta that the clerk, Ashok Pandey, demanded a bribe of Rs 2,500 from him for releasing his arrears. When superintendent of Lokayukta police Gopal Singh inquired into the case, the complaint made by Verma was true. Lokayukta then laid a trap and arrested Pandey.

SATNA Biker killed in road accident

A biker was killed after an unidentified vehicle hit on the Chitrakoot state highway on Friday. The biker was identified as Satyanarayan Singh, resident Turra village under Majhgawan police station. In another incident, a truck driver was injured after his vehicle loaded with tomatoes turned turtle near Unchehara Marg. Some villagers rushed to the spot and took out the driver from the truck and sent him to hospital.

GANJ BASODA De-addiction campaign launched

Chairperson of Nagar Palika Shashi Anil Yadav has launched drug de-addiction campaign. As part of the drive, the students made Rangolis through which they appealed to people to keep away from drugs and alcohol. Yadav appealed to people to discard drugs and encourage others to avoid it. Drugs have broken back of the youth, she said. Chief municipal officer Jayant Verma appreciated the Rangolis made by the students.

SIRONJ Mandi officials to register FIR for theft

Krishi Mandi administration agreed to register an FIR in connection with the theft of soybeans after the intervention of a Congress leader. Ravi Yadav, a resident of Tori Bagrod village, went to Krishi Mandi to sell soy bean. When his produce was being weighed, a sac containing soy bean was stolen. Yadav informed national coordinator of the Kisan Congress Surendra Raghuvanshi over the phone, Raghuvanshi spoke of the officials of the Mandi administration. An FIR was lodged after his intervention. He said that incidents of theft are increasing at Mandi. If such incidents do not stop, the Congress will launch an agitation, he said.

TRAGIC | Public beating, humiliation leads to suicide Man flashes private parts, woman hangs self in shame

A parking dispute between a 43-year-old woman and her neighbour soon turned so ugly that not only was the woman thrashed publicly by the neighbour and his wife but the man also allegedly flashed his private parts at her during the incident.

The humiliation and embarrassment endured by the woman proved unbearable for her and she ended her life by hanging herself at her home. This tragic incident took place in the Aerodrome police circle area in the wee hours of Friday. The woman had been distressed by her husband's extramarital affair for years, for which she faced regular public taunts and isolation from the community. The public humiliation and not getting police aid proved to be the last straw and she took the extreme step.

Family members alleged that a neighbour, wearing only underwear, assaulted and abused her publicly over a parking dispute. He even flashed his private parts and kicked her on her private parts. He made vulgar gestures and comments, causing

her severe public embarrassment. Distressed by the incident, the woman hanged herself on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday.

The family added that several people gathered at the spot but remained mute spectators to the whole incident and no one came to her rescue. The deceased's son said that Jaiprakash who is their neighbour used to park his vehicle in front of their house and they had asked him multiple times not to do so. On Thursday night, his mother went to move the vehicle herself, and the vehicle fell in the process. Jaiprakash and his wife accosted and assaulted her publicly on the road. He added that thereafter they returned home, she made dinner for him around 2 am and when he woke up around 6 am the next day, he found her hanging.

The deceased's nephew added that as a result of the assault his aunt fell in the mud, staining her clothes. He too corroborated the statement of the deceased's son about the violence. The police have begun an investigation into the case and registered a case for abetment to suicide against the accused.

Suicide Note

The deceased Anita (name changed) left a suicide note seeking justice and expressing her anguish over the ongoing conflict with her neighbour about parking of vehicles and her husband's relationship with another woman. She wrote in the suicide note, "I am committing suicide because I am fed up with my neighbour Jaiprakash Sharma and his wife Pooja. Both of them thrashed me publicly on the road and I don't want to live anymore. I have also been distressed by my husband's behaviour for the last 15 years. He is having an affair with a woman and has left the house four years ago. Because of this, the neighbours harass me and regularly taunt me. My husband is not even divorcing me because of her and does not come home. What should I do? I want justice. My husband has sold the house, utensils, jewellery, everything." In her suicide note, she held the neighbour, his wife and another woman responsible for her decision.

Police accused of inaction

The nephew of the deceased said, "Last night, my aunt, uncle and grandmother went to the police station to file a complaint against the accused, but the police didn't take any action. The police personnel misbehaved with her, sided with the accused and asked her to go home. My aunt committed suicide out of shame. If the police had taken action on time, my aunt would be alive today."

Shame on onlookers

The onlookers felt no shame while watching this tragedy, as nobody, not even a single man or woman came forward to help the victim. The incident in itself is shameful, but turned out to be more awful as the people around were merely watching the whole incident instead of coming to her aid.

Chambal bridge open to heavy vehicles

The Chambal Bridge closed for heavy vehicles for over a year was open to heavy vehicles on Friday. The bridge connects Bhind in MP with Etawah district in UP.

After was open, a large number of vehicles were seen on the bridge. Drivers have to follow a set of norms to use the bridge. Else, a heavy fine will be imposed on them.

To keep an eye on the vehicles, the administration has set up a committee consisting of officials.

A few days ago, collector of Etawah Avnish Rai issued an order to set up a committee. The Chambal Bridge is 60 years old.

As the chamber of pillar number eight of the bridge was damaged last year, the administration stopped plying of vehicles on the bridge in June last year. Barriers were also put up on the bridge to stop the heavy vehicles, but the

PNC Company which collects toll on the bridge was trying to open it. The management of the company told the UP and MP governments that they would repair the bridge and follow the government rules.

The company held a video conferencing with the chief engineer of Road Transport Corporation on March 14 this year. There was an agreement on opening the bridge for entry of heavy vehicles on the basis of an inquiry report prepared by IIT Kanpur.

MP from Bhind Sandhya Rai held a video conferencing with Chief Minister Mohan Yadav and demanded him to open the bridge for entry of heavy vehicles. The district administration Etawah said that vehicles above 50 tonnes would not be allowed to operate on the bridge.

The officials of the Etawah district administration also said that vehicles running above 40km an hour would not be allowed.

No gas cylinder refilling without E-KYC update

Gas consumers who have not yet registered their KYC and mobile numbers with the agency will not be able to receive gas cylinders from July 1.

Such consumers are required to visit their nearest gas agency to complete their KYC. Vikram Singh Bhati, the operator of the Tanot Bharat Gas Agency, informed us that

all gas consumers must visit the Tanot Gas Agency to complete their KYC. Consumers need to bring their gas connection diary and Aadhaar card, and the person in whose name the gas connection is registered must personally visit the agency for biometric fingerprint KYC.

If anyone isn't registered, they will be unable to receive or refill gas cylinders as of July 1.

Woman jumps from terrace, dies, family alleges blackmail

A 27-year-old woman committed suicide by jumping from the terrace of her office building in the Kanadiya police circle on Thursday. CCTV footage of the incident surfaced, showing her talking to someone on her mobile phone. She initially climbed onto the boundary wall but got off it. Later, she climbed back on and jumped to the ground floor. Her family members alleged that someone was troubling and blackmailing her over the phone, which led her to take this extreme step. The deceased was identified as Bulbul Chandela, a resident of Kanadiya village. The incident oc-

curred around 11:15 am and she was rushed to the hospital where she succumbed to her injuries during treatment. Kanadiya police station in-charge KP Yadav stated that she committed suicide but the reason has not yet been ascertained. It was clear she was talking to someone on her mobile before taking the harsh step. Her mobile phone was seized and a request for her Call Detail Record (CDR) has been made. Her uncle Dinesh alleged that someone was troubling and blackmailing her over the phone, which led her to take this extreme step. She left her mobile phone on the boundary wall before jumping.

Cop held for abetting firm manager's suicide

A sub-inspector was arrested on Friday in connection with the suicide of a firm manager when he went to surrender at the Bhopal district court.

Ayodhya Nagar police station TI Mahesh Lihare told Free Press that Manoj Raghuvanshi, the manager of the Indian Potash Limited (IPL), died by suicide at his house in November. Raghuvanshi had named seven persons, including his wife, the SI and five others, for the extreme step in

his suicide note. Raghuvanshi had mentioned that his wife often used to mount pressure on him to give her money and name the property registered on his name to her name. The SI, Gaurav Raghuvanshi, who was posted in Vidisha then, was booked in March. In April, DCP (Zone-2) Shradha Tiwari had also announced a reward of Rs 5,000 on any leads pertaining to the absconding SI. On Friday, the SI went to the Bhopal district court to surrender, during which he was arrested by the police following a tip-off.

Dumpers confiscated

Narmadapuram: The police, mining and revenue departments have jointly launched a campaign against the illegal miners. District mining officer said that seven dumpers had been seized for carrying illegally mined sand near Padghal toll on Thursday. The seized dumpers had been parked on the premises of the Seoni-Malwa police station.

One killed in group clash, 3 cops suspended for not filing plaint

A man was killed and another injured in a clash between two groups over a piece of land in Kanya Khedi village under Jawar police station on Thursday night.

The police, however, did not initially register a complaint of the family members of the person who was killed in the incident.

A video of the police station went viral. When superintendent of police Mayank Awasthi came to know of the incident, he suspended sub-inspector Anil Dodiya, a head constable Bharat Ram and a constable Arjun Singh.

When a man Balwan Singh, who sustained injuries in the incident, went to the police station to lodge a complaint about the incident, he died at

the hospital. The injured is still at the hospital. The video shows that the policemen pushed those who went there to lodge a complaint.

On getting information, sub-divisional officer of police Akash Amalkar also rushed to the spot. According to reports, Sobhal Singh Thakur, Lakhan Singh and Bijendra Singh had a dispute with Chetan Singh, Balwan Singh and Arjun Singh.

Arjun and Balwan sustained severe injuries in the clash. Balwan, who went to Jawar police station to lodge a complaint, slumped to the ground because of injuries.

Arjun is still undergoing treatment. He was sent to a hospital where he died. Family members of Balwan said that he had been battered to death.

would be known only after the postmortem. Amalkar said that two groups fought over a piece of land in Kanyakhedi village and some people sustained injuries in the incident.

Three policemen have been suspended; and an inquiry into the incident is going on, he said.

Blind turns causing accidents

A blind turn has been created on Mumbai-Agra Highway No. 15 due to encroachment in Seoni Malwa, Narmadapuram district.

The farmers Lakshminarayan, Mukesh, and Rajesh, all

sons of Ramvilas Jat, have encroached upon the government land belonging to the Public Works Department and the Revenue Department. This land connects the main road to Gajanpur. They have taken illegal possession of the land and are using it for farming activities. Due to this, a

blind turn has been created, leading to frequent accidents. In the past two years, around six people have lost their lives due to this. The local villagers have demanded immediate removal of this encroachment and action against the encroachers from the district administration.
