A few decisions made by the district officials during the YSRCP's rule irked the locals to a considerable extent.

Following its thumping victory in 2024 polls, the BJP-TDP-JSP leaders got into action to 'undo' them with immediate effect.

After the initial rounds of the vote counting exercise on June 4, yellow-tinted flags of the TDP were seen fluttering at the 'otherwise' restricted zone of the tourism project developed in Rushikonda.

Although the YSRCP did

take up a massive development project uphill under the banner of tourism, it drew criticism partly for violating the norms and more for excavating beyond the area permitted by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change spending Rs 500 crore approximately.

The area was highly restricted during the YSRCP government. But on the counting day, the TDP flags found a place uphill.

Near Tycoon junction in Siripuram, the most frequented lane was blocked with concrete dividers, causing a great deal of incon-

venience for the commuters as they have to take a long route to reach the other side of the road. For long, Jana Sena Party leaders have been protesting against this in the city as they claimed that the blocking exercise was aimed at paving the way for the real

estate project of YSRCP former MP MVV Satyanarayana as a part of a remedial measure for Vastu.

Despite the protests, the road continued to be blocked. However, the next day of the vote counting exercise, ISP leaders removed the junction. But their move lasted for a while as the traffic police rearranged the blocks back in its place. The police cautioned that such moves will be taken up after they receive instructions from the higher authorities.

In addition, the YSR viewpoint developed by the GVMC at Seethakonda, Jodugullapalem as part of its beautification works witnessed a new twist. A group of people covered the name with a banner of 'Abdul Kalam viewpoint' even as the counting exercise was in

Later in 1989 elections, Prasada Rao won as Congress nominee by defeating TDP candidate Simma Prabhakar Rao. Again in 1994 elections, Prasada Rao was defeated in the hands of TDP candidate Baggu Laxmana Rao. But in the 1999 elections. Prasada Rao won against his rival TDP candi-

date Baggu Laxmana Rao. By 2004 elections, Prasada Rao was shifted to Srikakulam Assembly constituency after fielding his elder broth-Congress candidate for Nar-

asannapeta constituency. From Srikakulam constituency, Dharmana Prasada Rao was elected twice as Congress candidate in 2004 and in 2009 elections by defeating the TDP candidate and former minister Gunda Appala Surya Narayana. In the two terms, Prasada Rao had served as minister for revenue and also minister

for roads and buildings. However in 2014 elections, Prasada Rao was defeated in the hands of TDP by a margin of 24,131 votes.
