Ichhawar: The residents of Nadan village Panchayat dominated by tribal people cleaned up a stream. Despite HC order, illegal hoardings not removed

There may be accidents anytime

The civic body has not removed the illegal hoardings put up in different places in the city despite an order of the high court.

Although the hoardings have been put up at the vantage points in the city, chief municipal officer Sushma Dkakad has not confiscated the hoardings that may cause accidents anytime.

The issue came to light when a petition was filed at the high court demanding action against the officials of the civic body.

The complainant demanded the suspension of in-charge assistant engineer and then the in-charge CMO Megh Tiwari and other officials.

The complaint was sent to the urban administration department, Bhopal and collector of Damoh.

When action was not taken to remove the illegal hoardings, the complainant went to court.

In the complaint, it was said that hoardings have been put up on PWD land, government schools, Nuzul land, and on the plots be-

longing to the civic body. Apart from that, more than 100 hoardings and flexes have been put up on trees and on electricity poles.

The complainant said that those who put up the hoardings are hand in glove with the officials of Nagar Palika.

Complainant further said that the hoardings occupied many places in the city.

According to reports, a petition was filed in the high court. When the petition was being heard, the officials of Nagar Palika assured the court that they would remove the hoards from the city.

One and a half years have passed since the promise was made, but the hoardings have not been removed.

Man bludgeoned to death in Gunga, face burnt to conceal identity

A man said to be in his mid-30s was found dead in a forest in a village near Gunga area of Rural Bhopal on Wednesday, the police said. His face was burnt to conceal his identity. The police have begun probe into the case.

Superintendent of police, Bhopal rural, Pramod Kumar Sinha, said man who was found dead had been identified as Sher Singh (36). He was a resident of Berasia who used to work at a crusher plant in Gunga.

On Tuesday, he went missing after which his kin lodged a missing person's

complaint. The police had registered a case and had launched a hunt to trace him.

On Wednesday noon, his kin discovered him lying dead in a forest located in a village in Gunga area of Bhopal. They informed police who rushed to the spot and began a probe. SP Sinha said that injury marks were found on Singh's body due to which, it is suspected that he might have been bludgeoned to death. Traces of petrol were also found on his face, which was burnt, which hints towards the fact that it was done to conceal his identity. The police have now launched a probe to nab the accused involved in the crime.

Collector issues malaria prevention guidelines

Collector Sonia Meena issued instructions during a meeting on malaria prevention and necessary measures on Wednesday. The Collector directed all Chief Executive Officers of Janpad Panchayats and Municipal Officers to launch anti-malaria campaigns in their areas, raising awareness about cleanliness and prohibiting open water storage to prevent malaria.

Residents are advised not to store water in open containers, tires, pits, or open tanks, as stagnant water can breed malaria-carrying mosquitoes. Only the ELISA test should be con-



ducted for malaria diagnosis, as it is the only approved test.

She directed all the government departments to ensure there was no stag-

nant water in their office coolers, changing the water weekly.

District Malaria Officer Arun Shrivastava reported ongoing malaria testing and treatment efforts. He said that fogging is also being carried out in homes, though its effect lasts only 5-7 minutes. Shrivastava emphasized that coolers are a significant source of mosquito breeding.

Physical control is crucial; ensure no water accumulation around homes and keep water covered. If water stagnates in open pits or other areas, apply oil to destroy mosquito larvae. Clean coolers weekly and change the water regularly, said Shrivastava.

Video of 2 stealing petrol, diesel from tankers at Khajuri Sadak depot viral

A video of two persons stealing petrol and diesel from tankers parked at fuel depot on Khajuri Sadak has gone viral. A complaint has also been registered in this regard. Further investigations are underway.

Khajuri Sadak police station TI Neeraj Verma told Free Press that incidents of fuel theft incidents were on the rise at the depot. Fuel is also stolen from buses and trucks parked along roadside restaurants.

On Monday, owner of one of the roadside restaurants filmed a video of two people stealing fuel from a tanker parked there. The tanker's fuel lid was locked. The accused tried to break it with a screw driver, after which they stole the fuel. When the restaurant owner told them not to do so, they even argued with him.

The restaurant owner then called the police but the accused fled by then. The driver of the tanker Fauzdar told the police that when he showed the filmed video to the accused, they threatened him with dire consequences. A police probe is underway into the incident.
