After debacle, BJP leaders question Annamalai strategy

AFTER the BJP drew a blank in the Lok Sabha elections in Tamil Nadu and at least 10 of its candidates came second, the internal rumblings in the party seem to have boiled over. Several leaders have started openly questioning the election strat egy adopted by BJP state president K Annamalai and blamed him for promoting a coterie. "Any man with little moral left in him will resign or at least make a drama that he is resigning. I know Annamalai lacks morals," said state BJP's intellectual cell leader Kalyaan Raman.

On Thursday, after warning BJP's social media activists of stringent action if they write anything wrong about party leaders, Tamilisai Soundararajan, former president of the state unit, lamented how a lack of strategy has put paid to the party's chance of winning seats. "Had we devised a strategy, we would have won this election. We (the candidates for LS polls) may not have ended as runners-up. We devised strategy (in the past). But Annamalai



did not want that. Us emerging as runners-up won't help because only by winning we can serve people better," she said.

She also backed the view of former AIADMK minister S P Velumani who had said that if the alliance between the AIAD MK and BJP remained intact, around 30 seats could have been won in the election. Vinoj P Selvam, state general secretary and BJP candidate for Chennai Central constituency who came second in the seat, also said that had the AIADMK and BJP contested together, the alliance would have won many seats.

While a few on social media asked whether a measured leader like Tamilisai would be the best bet for the party at this hour, several BJP supporters rejected the idea and said Tamilisai expressing views in public was not good for the good work done so far.

Kalyaan Raman, state BJP's intellectual cell leader, was more direct in his attack. He said Annamalai thinks all senior leaders are liability for the party and he alone works for the BJP's good.

"Annamalai managed to build an ecosystem in Delhi that will protect and insulate him. Somewhere justice should prevail for all souls who have done their best to grow the party like Pon Radhakrishnan, H Raja, CP Radhakrishnan, Tamilisai Soundararajan, L Ganesan, and a host of others. They were all belittled by this war room thugs led by @ikkmurugan, @amarprasadreddy, @ Johni_raja @indhavaainko and a host of others who all never had an iota of idea about who is Annamalai and what he was doing in Karnataka and how he was thrown out of Karnataka by the then political leadership for spying on them,' Kalyaan Raman said.

Naidu balancing act to form govt

TDP-led NDA wins 164 of 175 Assembly seats in Andhra, may take 25 MLAs/MLCs in cabinet

AS the TDP-led NDA in the State won 164 MLAs out of the total 175 seats, formation of Cabinet is going to be a tough task for TDP supremo N Chandrababu Naidu, who is set to take oath as Chief Minister on June 12. Of the 164, the TDP on its own had won 135 seats and it would be a herculean task for Naidu to pick from them.

With the NDA sweeping eight out of the 13 combined districts and more candidates from the politically dominant castes including Kamma, Kapu and Reddy and also more number of MLAs elected from BC, SC and ST categories, maintaining the caste and regional balances is expected to be a big puzzle. Apart from the Chief Minister, there is a possibility to take 25 MLAs/MLCs into the Cabinet. The Speaker post will also be added to the tally.

The question comes here is who is going to be inducted into the Cabinet and what about the fate of the senior leaders like P Ashok Gajapati Raju and Yanamala Ramakrishnudu, Daughters of both the said leaders were elected as MLAs but their elevation to Cabinet is unlikely

Observing that the TDP may provide four to five Minister berths to the alliance partners JSP and BJP, a senior leader of the TDP said in that case 20 to 21 Minister berths will be left for the TDP. As party general secretary Nara Lokesh is likely to be inducted into the Cabinet, the party will have to follow the social and regional equations in accommodating the remaining Minister berths, he said.

Predicting that the Cabinet will have both senior leaders and youth, he said that as almost all the ministers served between 2014 - 19 have been elected this time, it is natural for them to aspire to the Minister berth making things com-

plicated further. The sources further said as the TDP is now part of the NDA government at the Centre, it may urge the Centre to give Governor post to the said two senior leaders. As the tenure of Yanamala as MLC is not completed yet, he may also be considered for the Minister post in the State Cabinet, the sources added.

When it comes to the remaining aspirants, sources informed that TDP president K Atchannaidu may not get the Minister post in case of his nephew K Ram Mohan Naidu getting the Cabinet berth in the Union Cabinet. In such a scenario, Koona Ravi Kumar will be the front runner for the post from Srikakulam district.

From Vizianagaram and Visakhapatnam districts, K Kala Venkata Rao and Ch Ayyannapatrudu may be given preference going by their seniority. Vangalapudi Anitha and Gummadi Sandhyarani from Visakhapatnam and Vizianagaram districts may also be considered.

From East Godavari, several seniors including Goruntla Butchaiah Chowdary, Jyothula Nehru and Nimmakayala Chinarajappa are eying for the Minister post. From West Godavari, Nimmala Ramanaidu, Pithani Satyanarayana and K Raghurama Krishna Raju are aspiring for the Minister post.

Kollu Ravindra and Kolusu Parthasarathy, both hails from BC communities are anticipating the posts from Krish-

Kerala CPM to introspect after setback in LS polls

FACED with a humiliating defeat in the Lok Sabha elections, the CPM leadership has finally acknowledged the urgent need for critical introspection and drastic course correction. At the party secretariat meeting, leaders were unanimous in pointing out the need to identify lapses, right from candidate selection to vote-erosion. Silencing criticism will

only lead to self-destruction, a charged-up CPM state secretary M V Govindan reportedly said at the party's preliminary election review meeting. "If a change cannot be brought in now in the way the committees function, the party will not last long," he is learnt to have said.

There was severe criticism of the manner in which differences of opinion within the party are being suppressed. "If anyone criticises a position or policy she or he is with disciplinary action. If the state secretariat continues to function in this manner, there is bound to be a huge backlash," he reportedly said.
