

Babycare blaze: Decide on fire safety norms, says HC

Directs govt, DFS to file an action taken report within eight weeks

THE Delhi High Court on Saturday directed the Delhi government to decide two representations seeking regular fire safety audits and framing of fire safety norms for small hospitals and nursing homes in the wake of a harrowing fire tragedy at a private neonatal nursing home that claimed the lives of seven newborns.



A bench of Acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Manmeet PS Arora said the two petitions raising the issue of fire safety should be treated as representations by the government that shall decide them by passing detailed speaking orders within four weeks.

The court also directed the Delhi government and the Department of Delhi Fire Service to file an action taken report within eight weeks and listed the matter for reporting compliance on August 9.

Delhi government standing counsel Santosh Kumar Tripathi submitted that it was not treating the petitions as adversarial and it was willing to incorporate the just and fair suggestions given by the petitioners in fire-fighting norms.

The plea filed by one Shweta, who claimed to be a social worker, sought directions to authorities to have a regular comprehensive fire safety audit, ensure proper fire-fighting systems and address the issue

The other petition filed by

Yugansh Mittal said in the aftermath of the neo-natal centre fire incident, a disturbing pattern is emerging and it appears that in a bid to avoid complying with any fire precautions, such small or medium hospitals seem to be taking advantage of "ambiguity" in rules.

Advocate K C Mittal, who appeared for the petitioner, referred to a news report and said that almost 1000 hospitals are registered with the Delhi government, however, only 196 have the fire NOC.

"It is really shocking that as per the news report, only about 20 per cent of the hospitals have fire NOCs, logically the sequitur being that 80 per cent or almost 804 hospitals are not having fire NOCs and are at risk of a fire hazard," he said.

The plea sought a direction for framing of different set of basic norms that could be implemented by smaller hospitals and nursing homes such as having sprinklers and automatic fire alarms.

It also sought direction that authorities inspect smaller hospitals and nursing homes in Delhi for compliance of already established fire safety norms under the Delhi Fire Service rules, 2010. Six newborns died in the fire at the Baby Care New Born Hospital in Vivek Vihar here on the night of May 25 which took the lives of 7 infants, he said.

The plea said authorities should be directed to ensure registration and timely renewal of requisite licences for running these establishments.

CM'S BAIL CASE

'Creating drama': BJP sends ambulance to Kejriwal's house

THE Delhi BJP on Saturday said that Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal who was in the best of his health and campaigned for 20 days, is now seeking medical bail on health grounds.

Delhi BJP President Virendra Sachdeva said that Kejriwal got his bail on the condition of surrendering on June 2 but he has only tried to get the orders changed and is shamelessly fighting to get his bail extended.

Senior BJP leader Vijay Goel sent an ambulance to take Kejriwal to hospital for medical tests after the AAP leader claimed he might be suffering from some serious ailments.

Kejriwal moved the SC on May 26 seeking extension of his interim bail by seven days on grounds that he has to undergo some medical tests, including a PET-CT scan. The police, however, stopped the ambulance and Goel en route to the CM's official residence in Civil Lines.

Goel alleged that Kejriwal was 'creating drama' by citing health issues to gain people's sympathy. "This ambulance was to take Kejriwal to any hospital where all his tests can be done within two to three hours," he told reporters.

THE Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on Monday, the Delhi government's plea seeking direction to Haryana and Himachal Pradesh governments to supply additional water to the capital in view of the severe water crisis.

As per the cause list on the apex court website, a two-judge vacation bench led by Justice P K Mishra and Justice K V Viswanathan is likely to hear the matter on Monday.

Amid serious heatwave conditions and the ensuing water shortage in the city, the AAP government on Friday moved the Supreme Court seeking direction to Haryana and Himachal Pradesh to provide more water to the national capital.

"Delhi's need for water has increased in the scorching heat. It is everyone's responsibility to fulfil the needs of the capital," the petitioner said. Tempera-

tures in Delhi soared to nearly 50 degrees Celsius, with little relief in sight, as the arrival of Southwest monsoon to the capital is unlikely before June 20-25, the weather office forecasts.

"Access to water is one of basic human rights; access to water also forms essential component of guarantee of dignity and quality of life guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution," the plea said. "The current water crisis, which may only get worse given peak summers and ongoing water shortage, violates the right to a dignified and quality life of the people of Delhi, who are unable to access even adequate clean drinking water."

The unprecedented surge in temperatures has triggered extraordinary and excessive demand for water, which is not being met by supply from neighboring states, thereby causing a full-fledged water and sanitation crisis, the plea added.

Air quality panel constitutes team to control winter pollution levels

THE Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has sprung into action earlier than usual to control winter pollution levels in Delhi-NCR.

The central body has constituted an enforcement team to monitor the on-ground implementation of the commission's guidelines. The team will monitor and enforce the pollution control guidelines of the central agency. Strict action will be taken against those who violate the rules, officials said.

Although the level of pollution in the national capital is higher than normal even during summers, people have to endure the scourge of air pollution during the four months of winter due to unfavourable atmospheric conditions. To prevent such circumstances, the pollution-control body usually enforces the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) between October and February. The CAQM continuously issues instructions to control the factors responsible for pollution.

The enforcement task force is constituted by the pollution-control body comprises six members with technical and administrative experience. According to the instructions



issued by the commission in this regard, this enforcement task force will monitor the measures towards prevention of pollution in the national capital region as well as enforce the guidelines and rules issued by the commission.

SFI holds protest against 'war crimes' in Palestine

THE Students Federation of India (SFI) joined the protest called by Left-progressive organizations against Israel atrocities in Palestine at Jantar Mantar on Saturday. The protest was held to express concerns and condemnation over recent events of violence in Palestine, particularly the attack on Rafah.

"The loss of civilian lives is tragic and unacceptable. According to reports, Israeli shelling and airstrikes have resulted in the deaths of at least 37 people, most of whom were sheltering in tents in camps outside the southern Gaza city of Rafah. This is enough to expose the genocidal intentions of Israel," an SFI leader said during the protest.

Sagar Singhal, SFI Delhi State Committee Member, addressed the gathering saying, "The student community has opposed Israel's occupation of Palestine; our slogan, 'From the river to the sea, Palestine will be free'. Today, when Israel has crossed all limits, and humanity is at stake, we reaffirm our support with the people of Palestine."

CPI(M) General Secretary Sitaram Yechury and senior leader Brinda Karat also joined the protest demonstration. Karat vehemently opposed Israel offensive into Gaza, and the mounting death toll.
