

Mahara demands bypoll counting under CCTV camera surveillance

The Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC) president Karan Mahara has demanded that the counting of votes for the Manglaur and Badrinath Vidhan Sabha by-election should be done under surveillance of the CCTV cameras. He said that the election commission should also ban the presence of other officers other than election officers inside the counting centres.

Mathura Dutt Joshi said that the PCC president has written a letter to the chief election commissioner of India and chief electoral officer, Uttarakhand in this regard. In the letter Mahara said that the Congress had complained many times in the past about the misuse of official machinery during the election campaign and on the day of voting in Manglaur and Badrinath. He said that on the day of voting an incident of firing and violence in presence of Police

personnel was reported in Libberhedhi of Manglaur assembly. Mahara said that miscreants belonging to other States attacked voters in booth number 53 and 54 and fired bullets due to which many workers of the Congress party got injured. Expressing concern on the possibility of misuse of official machinery on the counting day as well, the PCC president said that special measures should be taken by the EC in Manglaur and Badrinath on July 13.

Police arrest Nepalese gangsters scamming only Nepalese people in Garhwal

The police on Thursday arrested a gang of four Nepalese including a woman on charges of stealing money from people by intoxicating their food. They only targeted Nepalese as it made it easier for them to scam them to gain their trust before stealing their money, the Dehradun senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh said. He said that a man named Dharma Raj Malla said that he was sitting outside the old railway station in Rishikesh on July 8 to go to his home in Nepal when four people of Nepali origin including a woman came to him and started a conversation with him. They introduced themselves as Jamuna Devi, Sadanand, Puran Singh, Gagan Bahadur Shahi. They told him that they also live in Nepal and are going back too. They gained his trust and took him to a Dhaba nearby and while he was eating, they allegedly mixed something in the food after which he fell unconscious. He claimed that when he gained consciousness later, his money was stolen. The SSP said that the police registered an FIR and started an investigation. The police obtained the description of the suspects from the footage of CCTV cameras installed around the incident site. The police arrested the four accused from near the old railway station in Rishikesh, who were roaming around to scam another person, Singh claimed. He stated that the arrested accused were identified as Jamuna Devi (33), Sadanand Dhamala (38), Puran Singh (40) and Gagan Bahadur Shahi (33). They told the police that they used to work as daily wage labourers in Rishikesh and other districts of Garhwal. They said that they knew that during the pilgrimage season, the people of Nepali origin who take tourists to different Dhams, come to Rishikesh and other nearby places to return to Nepal as soon as the rainy season starts. They often have loads of money earned during the tourist season considering which they started targeting them. The SSP said they will be soon presented in court.

Dehradun roads crippled by school traffic chaos amid ineffective plans of authorities

As the schools reopen after the summer break in Dehradun which is a renowned educational hub in the country, the traffic situation has again started getting worse during peak hours. The city experiences a significant increase in traffic flow in the mornings and afternoons as school buses, private cars, motorcycles and public transport converge on the narrow, winding roads. This daily influx of vehicles leads to severe traffic congestion, testing the patience of commuters and posing challenges for the authorities. This condition intensifies during the time when school students go to schools in the morning and leave in the afternoon, particularly in the areas where schools do not allow parking within their premises, despite having ample space. Poor parking management can be observed outside several prestigious schools in Dehradun leading to traffic congestion on the nearby roads. This situation is evident at a private school adjacent to the Police headquarters, where both sides of the road are often occupied with poorly parked vehicles during peak hours, despite the school having sufficient parking space. Unfortunately, similar conditions can be observed in several other schools in the city. The traffic police initiated a campaign two years ago, warning schools of strict action if they did not allow parking within their premises for students' parents and school drivers during peak hours. While some schools complied for a few weeks, the situation eventually returned to normal. It was reported that larger schools allegedly exerted political pressure on the police officials concerned, as children of high ranking officials and political leaders attend these schools. According to a senior police officer, some prominent schools even threatened officials who attempted to enforce proper parking regulations. This lack of cooperation from schools and the alleged influence of powerful individuals has hindered concrete and practical solutions to alleviate the traffic congestion caused by inefficient parking management. The senior superintendent of police, Ajai Singh recently stated that the traffic police have identified 21 prominent schools in cluster areas of the city where traffic is severely affected by the influx of students and vehicles. The police have proposed changes in school timings to minimise the crowd of students and vehicles during peak hours. They believe that it will improve the traffic situation on main roads. However, local residents believe that proper change can only occur if schools actively collaborate with authorities to minimise traffic congestion. Many parents also expressed their frustration with the situation. Deepa Singh, whose son attends a private school in Dehradun, said that the school does not allow vehicles inside its premises due to concerns about maintaining the aesthetic appeal of the building. This often leads to difficulties in finding proper parking, especially during examination periods. "Many parents who can afford to wait for their children stay inside their vehicles for two to three hours during examinations to ensure they can leave on time," she added. Another mother, Priyanka Sharma said that schools do not care for parent's concerns regarding parking that leads to traffic congestion and inconvenience for both parents and commuters. While a change in school timings may offer some relief, allowing parents to park within the school premises will significantly alleviate the traffic congestion, she said.

BJP confident of winning Badrinath & Manglaur bypolls

The Bharatiya Janata Party has stated that the Congress is flummoxed going by the feedback of the voters in the Vidhan Sabha by-elections in Uttarakhand. The BJP State general secretary Aditya Kothari averred that the voters in both the constituencies have reposed their trust in chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami. Talking to the media here, the party's State general secretary Aditya Kothari said that the allegations levelled by the Congress regarding the Manglaur bypolls are fully baseless and are probably guided by an anticipated fear of defeat. Kothari alleged that the Congress first activists from other areas first caused disturbance and then that was escalated as alleged firing. Kothari said that viewing the attitude of the voters, the Congress is flummoxed and seeking repolling. In fact, the voters in Badrinath and Manglaur constituencies have voted for Prime Minister Narendra Modi and CM Dhami, he said.

Man arrested for enabling cheating in WII recruitment exam

The Uttarakhand Special Task Force (STF) in a joint operation with Haryana STF arrested an accused from Haryana on charges of facilitating cheating in the recruitment examination of Wildlife Institute of India (WII) in Dehradun. The senior superintendent of police of STF Ayush Agrawal said that WII organised an examination for the post of Multi Tasking Staff (MTS) on September 17, 2023 at Rajaram Mohan Roy Public School in Patelnagar. During the second shift of the examination, the investigators found activities of two candidates suspicious. On checking them, they allegedly recovered a small earphone from both candidates' ears and an electronic device with a camera from under their shirts on the chest and another electronic device with a mobile company's SIM from under the table. Suresh Kumar from WII staff registered an FIR against them at the Patel Nagar police station. The police then arrested both candidates named Navraj and Pradeep, both residents of Jind, Haryana, and sent them to jail. The SSP said that it came to light during investigation that the accused Pradeep had appeared in the examination in the name of another candidate Mohit Maurya. Besides this, the arrested accused also revealed about the other two accused, Sonu and Pawan, during interrogation. Agrawal said that Uttarakhand STF also raided several areas in Haryana to arrest the members of this gang but they fled. Subsequently, STF issued warrants for their arrest and Dehradun SSP also announced a bounty of Rs 15,000 on their arrest. He said that STF recently received confidential information about an accused hiding in Kaital, Haryana. Considering this, an STF team went to Kaital on Wednesday where they arrested the accused Sonu in a joint operation with Haryana STF late at night. He will be soon presented in a court in Dehradun, Agrawal said.

State Allied and Healthcare Council to come up in U'khand

The State government has decided to constitute the State Allied and Healthcare Council (SAHC) for improving the quality of the health services in the State. The health minister Dhan Singh Rawat gave instructions to the officers for setting up SAHC in the State under the National commission for allied and healthcare profession act while chairing a review meeting of the Health department at the State secretariat on Thursday. The minister said that SAHC will have a chairman and 30 members (seven permanent, 22 temporary). He said that the council will not only help in improving the health sector but will also

create new opportunities for those in the business of healthcare. The minister claimed that the council will also ensure high quality services in the paramedical field. Rawat said that all the entrepreneurs in the healthcare sector will have to register themselves in the council and its permission will be necessary for opening any institute of medical education. The Vice Chancellor (VC) of the Uttarakhand medical education university Dr ML Brahm Bhatt, secretary health R Rajesh Kumar, additional secretary Anand Srivastava, Amandeep Kaur, Namami Bansal, director general health Dr Tara Arya, director medical education Dr Ashutosh Sayana and others attended the meeting.

Canal city

The onset of monsoon and the consequent heavy downpour didn't just provide relief to the people of the provisional State capital Dehradun reeling under the unprecedentedly long heat wave but also helped a new realisation to dawn upon them that with all the roads inundated, their beloved city now resembles the beautiful canal city it was in yesteryears. The old timers fondly recall that a network of irrigation canals used to crisscross the landscape of Dehradun in the past. But in the last couple of decades, the wise votaries of development chose to dismantle most of the old canal network. Now intriguingly, thanks to the combined wisdom and vision of the multi-crore Dehradun smart city project executioners and the smart and competent babus running the civic bodies, the narrow lanes and crater-laden roads of the city are morphing into beautiful canals whenever it rains. The old world charm of Dehradun seems to return, albeit for a short period, during the bounteous monsoon season.

Trouble shooter

With his innate persuasive skills and imperturbable demeanour, Minister Dhan Singh Rawat has always played the role of trouble shooter par excellence for the saffron party in the Himalayan State. It is learnt that a temple named after Badrinath shrine is also coming up in the financial capital of the country, Mumbai. Some are not happy though and they are calling these shrine construction ventures and naming them after the hoary shrines, nestled in Garhwal Himalayas, as tantamount to insulting Sanatan Dharma itself. Given the sensitivity the Teerth Purohiths and traditional right holders have always shown on issues such as Char Dham shrine board, attempts to decide carrying capacity of Dhams and regulation of crowds in the Yatra, it is interesting to see how they will react to naming temples coming up in other parts of the country after the highly revered shrines.
