



FLOOD-HIT PEOPLE URGED TO MOVE TO RELIEF CENTRES

DISTRICT collector K Vetri Selvi and SP Kommi Pratap Siva Kishore visited the residents of Allurinarag of Velerupadu mandal who were inundated by Pedavagu flood on Friday and assured the victims of all possible help. SP Pratap Siva Kishore, project officer of ITDA M

Surya Teja, RDO K Addaiah along with officials of various departments met the residents of Allurinarag and enquired about their problems. Collector Vetri Selvi directed officials to quickly

move people, especially pregnant women, children and the elderly, to flood relief centres. She directed officials to provide food and accommodation facilities to the victims in the flood relief

centres. She travelled on bike to the remote areas where cars were not accessible and met the victims to know their problems and requested them to come to the flood relief centres.

Considering problems likely to happen, everyone should come to flood relief centres. She said that relief centres were safe during floods.

Later, she inspected the breach developed on the Pedavagu Bridge along with officials and directed officials of the irrigation department to take necessary steps immediately.

As there is a risk of inundation of the low-lying areas during the release of flood-water in the upper Pedavagu area, collector advised the Telangana Irrigation officials to take measures in this direction. If the officials inform at least 12 hours in advance before releasing water, the danger can be avoided and people can be moved to safer areas.

Collector was accompanied by district joint collector B Lavanyaveni, APEP-DCL SE Salmon Raju, DPO T Srinivasa Viswanath, Tahsildar, DSP and others.

DISTRICT collector K Vetri Selvi instructed all officials and staff to be on full alert till the flood danger is over in the district. The district administration is prepared to face the flood disaster.

After visiting flood affected villages in Kukkunur and Velerupadu mandals with the District SP, ITDA Project Officer and other district officials and inspecting the flood situation at the field-level, collector directed district officials at Jangareddygudem RDO office on the measures to be taken on the flood emergency.

She said that the roads should be repaired on a war-footing for relief measures in the flood-affected villages.

According to the Chief Minister's orders, all officers and staff should be fully available and serve the people during the flood.

As many as 24 villages in Kukkunur and Velerupadu mandals have been affected by floods, and people of those villages should be shifted to flood relief centres.

Pregnant women in flooded villages should be taken to the nearest hospital and children and the elderly should be taken to safer areas.

Lifeboats, life jackets and professional swimmers should be kept ready in case of emergency. In every village where the flood is severe, local VRO, Panchayat Secretary, police personnel and active responders who are interested in participating in the flood operation should be formed as a team and steps should be taken to utilise their services during an emergency.

A 24-hour command control room with a toll-free phone number 1800 233 1077 has been set up at the district level so that people can get information or report their problems during the flood.

District SP Kommi Pratap Shiva Kishore said that a strong information system should be established to provide timely information

on disaster management from the level of the district officer to the last level staff in the village.

District joint collector B Lavanyaveni said that the Edduvagu, Peddavagu and Errakalva are overflowing in Kukkunur and Velerupadu mandals, and the water release levels from them should be checked regularly and the officials of the irrigation department should inform the water release information at least 12 hours in advance. People can be moved to safer places. During the flood, a team of VRO, Panchayat Secretary, ANM, Secretariat staff and police staff was formed at the village level for emergency services and they should move the people of that village to safe places in coordination. Anti-venom medicines needed to treat snake bites should be made available in hospitals.

ITDA project officer M Suryatheja said that all the district level officials should closely monitor the duties assigned to their staff.

Jangareddygudem RDO K Addaiah, District Medical & Health Officer Dr Sharmishta, DPO Tuthika Srinivas Viswanath, Animal Husbandry JD Nehru Babu, Irrigation SE Prakash, ICDS PD Padmavathi and others were present.

Collector visits Madduru Lanka bund

EAST Godavari Collector P Prasanthi visited the Madduru Lanka of Kovvur mandal on Friday. She interacted with villagers and advised them not to go fishing and

bathing in the river as the flood level is high. A weak embankment in Madduru Lanka village was inspected.

She asked to make protective arrangements with sandbags to prevent flood water from entering the village.

She said that people should be shifted to the rehabilitation centre before the first warning is announced at Dowleswaram SAC Barrage. Farmers are asked to make arrangements to drain out the standing water in the fields. Collector

also visited Gandepalli and Chodavaram villages where the Errakaluva flows in Nallajarla mandal and reviewed the situation.

Anantapalli, Anumal-lanka, Chodavaram East, Chodavaram West, Gudepally and Nallajarla villages

have been affected by flooding. As many as 87 people have been identified for rehabilitation in MPP schools. It has been found that 405 acres are underwater.

Sub-Collector Ashutosh Srivatsava and Tahsildar P Krishna Rao were present.

Godavari turns furious

RIVER Godavari is turning furious as upper catchment areas have been receiving heavy rains under the influence of low-pressure area in the bay.

The water-level in the Godavari at Bhadrachalam is gradually rising due to the flood from the upper reaches.

The flood, which was under 22 feet on Thursday, rose to 25.3 feet on Friday afternoon. Peruru, located in the upper reaches of the Godavari, recorded 40.86 feet at 9 am on Friday. Floodwater from Indrawati and Peruru areas flows through Bhadrachalam. With this, the officials are predicting that the Godavari flood will reach the first warning level in Bhadrachalam.

The first warning alert will be issued at Bhadrachalam when 43 feet is recorded. If it reaches 48 feet, the second danger warning will be issued, and at 53 feet, the third danger warning will be issued. The Godavari catchment area is overflowing due to rain. Keeping this in mind, the higher officials have issued instructions to the sectoral officers working at the field level to be vigilant.

The flood that has risen in Bhadrachalam will reach the Sir Arthur Cotton Barrage (SACB) in Rajahmundry in 20 hours. Then some water is released into the sea and some water is released into the irrigation canals of the Godavari Eastern, Central, and Western deltas under the joint two Godavari districts.

About 3.43 lakh cusecs of water are being released into the sea from the SAC barrage on Friday.

If the Godavari level rises at Bhadrachalam, the flood pressure on Polavaram will increase. Polavaram backwaters on one side and flood water coming from Sabari on the other will inundate the Polavaram project submerging mandals like Devipatnam, VR Puram, Chinturu, Kunavaram, and Yetapakam mandals.

All this flooded area is under Alluri Sitarama Raju district. There have been two to three floods here every year for the past four years. Keeping this in mind, preparations have been taken with swimmers, boats, and NDRF teams ready in sensitive areas.

Errakaluva in spate due to rains

THE Errakaluva is in spate at Pothavaram in Nallajerla mandal. Due to heavy rains in Khammam district agency, heavy flood water is flowing from the dam in Konguvarigudem through Errakaluva.

In nine villages of Tadepalligudem mandal of West Godavari district, hundreds of acres are submerged in a water blockade due to the Errakaluva flood. Farms in Nandamuru, Madhavaram, Kansali

Palem (Nidadavole mandal), and other villages were submerged. Meanwhile, Velerupadu mandal of Eluru district recorded 26.9 cm rainfall and Buttayagudem 26.8 cm.

Ten mandals received more than 10 centimetres of rainfall. The district officials examined the flood situation in Kukunuru and Velerupadu mandals. Water was released from the Jangareddygudem Errakaluva reservoir through four gates. In Lakkavaram of Jangareddygudem mandal, paddy fields were submerged.

Pangidigudem road trapped in water blockade. In Buttaigudem mandal agency areas, traffic has come to a standstill due to the flow of hill streams on the roads. Floodwater is flowing down the road from the Aliveru Dam at Doramamidi. At Pattenna Palem, Jalleru brook is flowing fiercely. Crops in many areas of Jangareddygudem mandal have been submerged due to the on-going flood downstream from the project. Officials have warned people not to cross hill streams flowing on the roads.

Flood situation reviewed

DISTRICT collector of Alluri Sitarama Raju district AS Dinesh Kumar said that 174 villages will be affected by flood in Chinturu Division.

In Bhadrachalam, as soon as the first danger warning is received, people will be shifted to safer places (rehabilitation camps). Boats and professional swim-

mers are being arranged. He said that 8,800 tarpaulins and 20 generators are being assembled. He said that rehabilitation centres have been set up in flooded areas.

Collector conducted a review on the flood situation with the district officials on Friday. Joint Collector Bhavna Vashishta, DRO M Padmavati, DRDA PD V Murali, District Agriculture Officer SBS Nand, and others were present.
