Through college and my time in the Baptist Collegiate Ministries, I felt the call to vocational ministry. After graduating, I joined the staff of the BCM at Longwood and Mulberry Grove as Associate Pastor. Then in 2023, I had the opportunity to step into the Senior Pastor role at Mulberry Grove. It's a privilege to serve in the church I grew up in. My undergraduate degree

especially as a Christian. I think a lot of us grew up thinking doing something like that would send your soul straight to Hell. Over the past 4 years, I have realized that mental health struggles are no different than physical health struggles in the eyes of the Lord. Mental health can be easily hidden, but it's still an illness nonetheless. My brother, Scotty, was one of the seemingly most happy people I have ever known and I think anyone who knew him would agree. He dedicated himself to his family, his friends, his church and his community. He was very well known and loved in our community.

He was a member and a youth leader at **Jones Chapel Baptist Church**. He loved spending his time being a mentor to the young people. He's also remembered for being a great help and a great

friend to the older members of our church.

After his death in 2020, I wanted to do something. I wanted to make a difference and I wanted to make sure his name and memory stayed present and relevant. In 2021, I decided to start a team in honor of him for the Out of the Darkness Walk, an event held by the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. Saving just one life, just one family, church, or community from the pain and questions suicide leaves behind would be an amazing way to honor my brother. He was a first responder, so saving lives was at the forefront of his mind at all times. I quickly contacted Angel Chambliss because I knew she'd want to participate and help organize it all. This is how Team Maverick started to become what it is today. The team name is a representation of him because he loved Top Gun and we always wear blue, his favorite color.

This year was our 4th year. We moved our team from Richmond to Farmville and had a team of about 30 people. I have always wanted my brother to be remembered for the impact he made while he was here, not for how he left this world. I've always heard the dates on a headstone don't really matter, it's the hyphen between them that represents what you did while you were here. This year, we had numerous people join our team and walk in Scotty's memory who had never met him. But, they see the impact he left on our church and on those of us left behind who love him. The hyphen on his headstone only represents 26 years, but he changed so many lives. He led young people in the community to Jesus, he was a role model and an inspiration.

Team Maverick and the support from the community, friends and church family has been imperative in the healing journey. You genuinely never know what someone is struggling with internally, even if you are very close. Team Maverick is a reminder to spread love, kindness and joy to everyone you can.

On Monday, December 2, folks gathered at Rodeo's for an informational meeting led by Phillip Brown, Relationship Manager for the EverBless Foundation, formerly the Virginia Baptist Foundation. Each one in attendance received a folder of information outlining the eight main ways the EverBless Foundation assists individuals, churches, and other institutions with investments and endowments. EverBless has over 100 years of experience in endowment and trust oversight. Operating with a large pool of investors, the programs are individualized, strive for greater returns on your investment, and are less risky than many secular investment opportunities.

The following programs were briefly described:

- 1. Money Management (Equity, Balanced, and Fixed Income Portfolios)
- 2. Creating Church Funds (Building, Mission, Scholarship, Reserve, Cemetery, and Endowment)
- 3. Church Transitions (Distribution of Church Closure Funds and Continuing Ministry)
- 4. Last Will & Testament (Assistance with Will Preparation for those wishing to leave money to their church or a specific church program)
- 5. Charitable Remainder Trusts (Conversion of stock, real estate or cash into lifetime income to reduce income taxes and/or estate taxes and to leave money to one's church or other charities)
