

## *Descendants of Thomas Fish*

### *Generation No. 1*

1. THOMAS<sup>2</sup> FISH (?<sup>1</sup>)<sup>1</sup> was born Abt. 1755 in North Carolina<sup>2,3</sup>, and died August 13, 1840 in Renfro Valley, Rockcastle Co., Kentucky<sup>4,5</sup>. He married WINEFORD BIRNEY<sup>6</sup> 1781 in Guilford Co., North Carolina<sup>7</sup>, daughter of WILLIAM BIRNEY and MARY ?. She was born March 10, 1767 in North Carolina<sup>8</sup>, and died January 09, 1850 in Rockcastle County, Kentucky<sup>8,9</sup>.

#### Notes for THOMAS FISH:

Per family tree of Juanita Witt, Thomas Fish (1755-1840) emigrated from England, was liberated at age 21. Volunteered to the Revolutionary Army. Moved to Kentucky about 1800, lived in Madison & Rockcastle counties.

From letter written by Jesse Fish in 1869 to his nephew, James S. Fish of Crab Orchard, KY: "My grandfathers Fish and Birney are our remotest ancestors that I have had any particular account of and most of my information on that subject was long since verbally obtained from Mother [Wineford Birney Fish] and of course my narrative will be a little indefinite but as she appeared to be gifted with a very sound recollection I incline to believe that her statements were generally near about correct. I don't recollect of ever hearing the name of my grandfather (your Great Grandfather Fish, who emigrated from England and settled in the Colony of North Carolina something over one hundred years since but I have no recollection at this time of ever hearing anything said in relation to the name of the county where he lived and the most particular account I ever had concerning his is that he was killed by a hostile Indian while he was riding on a hunting excursion near a certain water course in N.C. that has been going by the name of Fish's River. I have no account as to the number of his children, but have been informed that his son Thomas (my Father) was a small boy at the time of his Father's death and his Mother having previously died, caused him to be placed in the hands of some disinterested individuals who (as I am informed) seemed to care very little about his future welfare, therefore he was compelled thereafter to stem the tide of adversity the best way that he could until relieved by becoming of sufficient age to manage his own concern, and subsequently to that time he joined the army as a volunteer and served a tour of duty on an expedition against the Tories and Indians who were being very troublesome to the frontier settlers in that part of the country during the time of the old Revolutionary war. After his return from the army he frequently was speaking of having marched through a village then in North Carolina called Moravian Town where he saw a Tory man hanging by the neck and from appearance had been in that condition for a day or two and the soldiers were not permitted to take him down in order that he might be buried. About the year 1781 he was married to my Mother (late Wineford Birney) she being the eldest child of William Birney who I believe was residing in Guilford County, N.C. and I suppose (from information) that my Father and Mother emigrated from that State to Madison County, Kentucky, packing a few household goods and their five children on horses traveling on Boone Trace by way of Cumberland Gap and Hazle Patch through a wilderness and settled on Paint Lick Creek a small distance above the mouth of Walnut Meadow fork about the year 1791, while Indians were being very troublesome in the way of killing and robbing of imigrants on that route." ...

"Sometime about the year 1800 they again moved with their 9 children before named and settled on waters of Roundstone some three fourths of a mile from mouth of Big Clear Creek, then in Madison County, but about the year 1810 was taken into Rockcastle. After settling at the last named place they had an increase of three more children, one daughter and two sons, the youngest one of all being a boy that was born dead and, of course, never had a given name, the two surviving ones being named Jane and Pleasant, making the total number of their living children eleven (11) all of them were grown and married a considerable length of time previously to the death of our parents. My father continued to live the balance of his days at the same place where he first settled on waters of Roundstone and there died the 13th day of August in the year 1840 and was buried next day at the old Grave Yard near to where Renfro Creek Meeting House formerly stood. He had no record of his age but was supposed to be near 85 (eighty five) years old at the time of his death."

Per letter by Jesse Fish, Jan. 1, 1869: "He [Thomas Fish] had acted as Justice of the Peace and member of Rockcastle County Court for some eight or ten years and afterwards was appointed by the Governor and commissioned to fill the office of high Sheriff under whom I acted as deputy during his term of two years."

Fish, Jan.1, 1869: "My mother (your grandmother Wineford Fish) being his [Thomas Fish's] widow, continued to live several years at the old place where he had died, but finally went to stay with her daughter Ann Smith near to Mount Vernon, where she continued to remain until the time of her death which I think occurred in the Spring of 1850, and she was buried by the side of your Grandfather. I was away from home at the time of her death and burial and therefore have failed to recollect the particular date. To the best of my recollection I have heard her say that she was born on the 10th day of March 1767, which made her about 84 (eighty four) years of age at the time of her death."

Notes for THOMAS FISH:

Per letter from Jesse Fish to his nephew, James S. Fish, dated Jan.1, 1869: "Your Uncle Thomas was the first Deputy Surveyor that ever done business of that kind in the County of Rockcastle about the year 1810 and 1811. William Smith (his brother in law) being principle surveyor at that time. In the fall of 1812 while our Government was engaged at war with Great Britton and their Indian allies, the latter became very troublesome to our frontier settlers between the Ohio River and Lakes of Canada. Consequently the governor of Kentucky issued a call for Volunteers in order to repel the savages, and in a short time a Brigade numbering over 2000 Mounted Troops were proceeding on their way to Wabash River in order to be mustered into service at Vincense. Your Uncle Thomas with his elder Brother (William Fish) joined a company that went on that expedition and served a short tour of duty as Rangers being detached for the purpose of guarding the inhabitants on the waters of Wabash beyond where the savages had lately been killing and scalping of men, women and children in Indiana Territory and after obtaining an honorable discharge from the army both of them immediately returned home to kentucky where your Uncle William continued to reside the remainder of his days.

"Your Uncle Thomas Fish bore the name of being a young man of uncommon steady habits and was considered by our parents to be the most sensible one of all their sons. He seemed to have a considerable inclination to travel and had a particular desire to visit some of our maternal relatives who were then a portion of them living in Mississippi and others in Louisiana. Consequently he left home in the Spring of 1813 and prodeeded directly to Boonsborough and there embarked as a hand on a Flat Boat which was loaded with cargo of Tobacco, etc., on which he descended on the Kentucky, Ohio & Mississippi Rivers to the City of Natchez, and after landing at that place and leaving the Boat he visited his grand Uncle (David Birney) an old settler then living some five or six miles from the City, and was bearing the name of a respectable citizen and was thought to be in a good condition as to property, etc. and after remaining several days at the house of Uncle David he set out and traveled about fifty or sixty miles across the country in a westwardly direction to where Uncle William Birney (a brother to our Mother) was then living some ten or twelve miles from the old post of Wacheta which is now known by the name of Monroe Court house, it being the county seat of Washeta County in the State of Louisiana.

"After arriving at Uncle William Birneys and remaining and laboring for wages mostly on a farm, he then changed his occupation and went to trading on water and running a Keel Boat until he finally ascended the Washita River a distance of some 300 miles (by way of the river) and took up his residence in Clark County not far from where Arkadelphia is now situated, and where he was living at the time Arkansas Territory was established in the year 1819. And in the same year he was appointed and commissioned by the Governor to fill the Office of Justice of the Peace and afterwards was elected to represent the people of Clark County and served in the lower branch of the first Legislative body that ever assembled in that Territory. There was a very peculiar incident occurred at the time of his election and as I never heard of a similar circumstance before nor since, I have concluded to report it in this short biographical sketch. It so happened that he did not lose a solitary vote in the Township where he was living although he had two competitors and one of them a Doctor in good standing. Subsequently he was married to a Miss Emily Hemphill with whom I was

personally acquainted in the year 1819 when I was detained in that country on account of sickness and being confined at her Mother's house in time of my worst affliction. Emily (who afterwards became his wife, appeared to possess a very mild disposition, had good education and was generally respected. I returned to Kentucky in the spring of 1820 which was previous to the time of their marriage and was subsequently informed that the Legislature of that Territory had lately abolished the Circuit Court System and that your Uncle Thomas Fish was then acting under an appointment as Judge of a Quarterly Court with the jurisdiction formerly appertaining to the Judges of Circuit Courts. I suppose he was holding the Judgeship when taken down with a disease in his side of which he died about the year 1823, leaving his wife without any children, they never having but one and that he outlived."

Notes for DAVID FISH:

Per letter from Jesse Fish to his nephew, James S. Fish, dated Jan. 1, 1869: "Your Uncle David Fish also emigrated to that country by water in the Spring of 1817 and became a citizen of Clark County and followed cutting and rafting of cypress trees out of Washeta River which he generally was selling down on the coast of the Mississippi for a few years before he was married to Miss Harriet Hemphill, a sister to your Uncle Thomas' wife, and who appeared to be a clever kind hearted woman with tolerable good education and was well esteemed. I have been informed that he was occupying a good farm of his own and was also running a cotton gin until the spring of 1832, and he shipped a cargo of cotton down to New Orleans and while there was struck with Cholera where he died and was buried in a public cemetery belonging to the City. Some few years previously to his death I was informed that he had served one or two terms as Senator in the General Assembly of that Territory. He was cut off in the prime of life being about forty years of age and left his wife with only one child a small daughter and the last time I heard from them they were both in bad health, and in all probability are now dead."

Per letter from Jesse Fish to his nephew, James S. Fish, dated Jan. 1, 1869:

" In the fall of 1812 while our Government was engaged at war with Great Briton and their Indian allies, the latter became very troublesome to our frontier settlers between the Ohio River and Lakes of Canada. Consequently the governor of Kentucky issued a call for Volunteers in order to repel the savages, and in a short time a Brigade numbering over 2000 Mounted Troops were proceeding on their way to Wabash River in order to be mustered into service at Vincense. Your Uncle Thomas with his elder Brother (William Fish) joined a company that went on that expedition and served a short tour of duty as Rangers being detached for the

purpose of guarding the inhabitants on the waters of Wabash beyond where the savages had lately been killing and scalping of men, women and children in Indiana Territory and after obtaining an honorable discharge from the army both of them immediately returned home to Kentucky where your Uncle William continued to reside the remainder of his days. He was Justice of the Peace, a member of Rockcastle County Court and captain of a Militia Company at the time and after he had served as a private in the Army, also was promoted to the office of Colonel of the 79th Regiment of Kentucky Militia. He closed his official career by filling the office of High Sheriff of Rockcastle County, under whom I acted as Deputy for his term of two years which expired at the end of 1821. At the times of his filling those different stations they were considered to be quite honorable, but at the present time and for a few years past it appears as though most of the highest functionaries in our government have been disgracing the offices they were pretending to fill."

The original log farmhouse assumed to have been built by James Fish about 1812 is still standing, but has been covered with siding and has had an addition added to the back where Rick and Kathryn Hysinger currently live with their 11-year old son, Richard. According to Rick, his grandfather, Samuel Hysinger, purchased the farm from John Fish (son of James Fish?) in 1880 or 81. Samuel lived there til his death with his brother Cecil, a lifelong bachelor. Cecil lived there until his death when the farm was purchased by Rick's side of the family.

Along with the graves of James & Sarah Fish are the graves of 2 slaves. Rick Hysinger told a story that he had heard from his grandfather that when the Fish family lived on the farm there was a large orchard on the hill where the house was. When the fruit was ripe the slaves would take some of it down into the hollow & make wine or other spirits for the use of the household (& others no doubt!).

William Fish, father of our subject, was a farmer in Rockcastle County, KY all his life, and was a man of considerable prominence in political and social affairs. About 1820 he was made sheriff of the county. He also served as a Colonel in the State militia. His wife, Annie, was born in Lincoln County, KY and was a daughter of Nathaniel Logan, of Irish descent. They had four children, viz: Sarah J., Harriet, William M. and John T. He and his wife lived to a good old age, and died in Rockcastle County, members of the Christian Church. Col. Fish had been married before he married Annie Logan,--married Sallie Maret, and had four children by his first wife, viz: Winnifred, Margaret, Stephen G. and Burnetta.

"William M. Fish was reared and educated in Rockcastle County, KY and from boyhood has devoted the greater part of his time to agricultural pursuits, owning a fine farm in Rockcastle County. It was with great difficulty that a jury was obtained, as nearly everybody had come to an opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the accused from reading the papers or from rumors. It took nearly an entire day to get a jury, but finally the following jurymen were sworn: A.K. Denny, J.M. Elder, Jno. W. Logan, J.B. McKinney, G.N. Bradley, John Jones, A.M. Jones, John Dinwiddie, Jno. Menifee, George Bright, George Tribble and T.M. White. After they were sworn, the attorneys for the defense put in the plea of not guilty on account of the insanity of the accused, to which plea of insanity the attorney for the Commonwealth replied in effect that it was simulated, not a real insanity, and that the case of the murder was jealousy. In other words, that there was a 'woman at the bottom' of the entire acts of the defendant Smith. A great many witnesses were examined, especially for the defense, the latter to prove the monomania of Mr. Smith. The witnesses for the prosecution, in giving their evidence in chief, necessarily confined themselves to the act and circumstances of the killing, which occurred on a Sunday morning in April last, in front of the Baptist church door, at Crab Orchard. Judge Carson, the man killed, was shot by Smith with a revolver, five times, either of which is thought would have produced death. Such was the advanced age (72 years) of the deceased. Divine services were just about to begin. A Mr. Foley was with Mr. Carson, who asked Smith not to shoot, and held him for a moment, but Smith was bent on killing Judge Carson. After shooting all the loads out of his revolver, but one, (which failed to fire), Smith walked deliberately across the street where his carpenter shop was situated, but was halted and arrested and taken to Stanford to jail. There was some proof that Carson, who was town Assessor of Crab Orchard, went to Smith's shop to get a list of his taxable property, some months before the killing, and that Smith greatly abused him. There was also some proof that a certain woman who lived near Crab Orchard, was visited now and then by both Smith and Carson, privately. Some proof was also given that Smith sometimes drank liquor, but not to excess. His character was proven by all the witnesses to have been that of a quiet, peaceable, unoffensive man, one who rarely ever said a word to anyone even on business. That he had a great impediment in his speech, and did not like to talk. At the close of the statements as to the killing, etc, the Commonwealth rested her case in chief. The defense then introduced their witnesses to prove the plea of insanity. The sister of Smith, with whom he lived, the niece of Smith and the brother, swore that Smith acted strangely for several months before the killing. That his health was bad, had but little appetite, was restless and lost much sleep. That he imagined there were several men after him to kill him. That there was a combination of men to ruin his character and break him up in business. That on one occasion

he told his sister, a maiden lady of fifty years of age, one night at home, that there were three men around the house who had come to harm him. Smith would not be satisfied until his sister or some one else, went for the town marshal and another person, to look for the three men. The marshal and another came, examined the premises, and told Smith no body was there, and that if he was afraid to stay there, to go and stay all night with one of them. Smith accepted the invitation, and went and staid all night with a Mr. DeBord. Other witnesses, among them Col. W.G. Welch, a Mr. Myers and others, testified to acts of monomania, or insanity. The defense introduced two physicians, who had heard all, or nearly all of the evidence and after defining the various species of insanity, said that, if the evidence was true, as detailed by the witnesses, then in their opinion as medical men, the man, John Smith, was of unsound mind. Other witness said that in their opinion, Smith was insane. The foregoing are the main details of the evidence in the defense. After this, the Commonwealth introduced rebutting evidence to show that Smith was a sane man. These were not medical men, however, but were the men who had known Smith for years. Many of them said they believed Smith to be of sound mind, from conversations they had with him on certain occasions. One other physician testified for the prosecution, but his evidence differed but little from that of the other two physicians who testified at the instance of the defense. At the conclusion of the testimony for and against the prisoner, the court gave full instructions to the jury, and adjourned them at five o'clock Tuesday evening, until after supper. The sheriff kept them together until half past six, p. m., when they were called together and the argument was opened for the defense by J.W. Alcorn, Esq., in a forcible speech of about one hour. He was followed by Col. G.W. Dunlap for the prosecution in a speech of much power. He spoke over an hour and a quarter. After this, the jury were discharged until Wednesday morning, at 9 o'clock. At that hour, W.O. Hansford addressed the jury for the defense for over an hour. His speech was a feeling and good one. He was followed by Judge M.C. Saufley for the prosecution in a somewhat lengthy speech, but it had a seemingly powerful effect upon the jury and the audience. Next and last came Col. T.P. Hill, for the defense, in one of the finest and ablest efforts he ever made in behalf of a criminal at our bar. His speech, nearly two hours long, was logical, beautiful, eloquent and convincing. The case was closed by Commonwealth Atoorney George Denny. Mr. Denny, as a prosecutor, has but few equals in any district of the State. To say that he did justice to the Commonwealth, would be only a slight compliment. His effort in the prosecution was bold and telling, and showed him to be capable of attending to the public interest in the field to which he has been chosen. A number of ladies attended the speaking, and seemed to be much entertained. The case was given to the jury at 6 o'clock, and they retired and remained in their room for about two hours, without making a verdict. The Judge then adjourned them for the night, but called them together the next morning and they remained out until nearly noon. Being wholly unable to agree, they came in and so announced to the court, and they were therefore discharged. How they stood in the matter, no one yet knows, as they made a solemn vow among themselves not to let the public know. Smith, of course, was remanded to jail, where he will remain until the next term of this court in April, and all the long and tedious trial will have to be gone through with again. Four days and a part of two nights were spent in the investigatin of the Smith case, which is quite one-third of the entire term."

After they were sworn, the attorneys for the defense put in the plea of not guilty on account of the insanity of the accused, to which plea of insanity the attorney for the Commonwealth replied in effect that it was simulated, not a real insanity, and that the case of the murder was jealousy. In other words, that there was a 'woman at the bottom' of the entire acts of the defendant Smith. A great many witnesses were examined, especially for the defense, the latter to prove the monomania of Mr. Smith. The witnesses for the prosecution, in giving their evidence in chief, necessarily confined themselves to the act and circumstances of the killing, which occurred on a Sunday morning in April last, in front of the Baptist church door, at Crab Orchard. Judge Carson, the man killed, was shot by Smith with a revolver, five times, either of which is thought would have produced death. Such was the advanced age (72 years) of the deceased. Divine services were just about to begin. A Mr. Foley was with Mr. Carson, who asked Smith not to shoot, and held him for a moment, but Smith was bent on killing Judge Carson. After shooting all the loads out of his revolver, but one, (which failed to fire), Smith walked deliberately across the street where his carpenter shop was situated, but was halted and arrested and taken to Stanford to jail. There was some proof that Carson, who was town Assessor of Crab Orchard, went to Smith's shop to get a list of his taxable property, some months before the killing, and that Smith greatly abused him. There was also some proof that a certain woman who lived near Crab Orchard, was visited now and then by both Smith and Carson, privately. Some proof was also given that Smith sometimes drank liquor, but not to excess. His character was proven by all the witnesses to have been that of a quiet, peaceable, unoffensive man, one who rarely ever said a word to anyone even on business. That he had a great impediment in his speech, and did not like to talk. At the close of the statements as to the killing, etc, the Commonwealth rested her case in chief. The defense then introduced their witnesses to prove the plea of insanity. The sister of Smith, with whom he lived, the niece of Smith and the brother, swore that Smith acted strangely for several months before the killing. That his health was bad, had but little appetite, was restless and lost much sleep. That he imagined there were several men after him to kill him. That there was a combination of men to ruin his character and break him up in business. That on one occasion he told his sister, a maiden lady of fifty years of age, one night at home, that there were three men around the house who had come to harm him. Smith would not be satisfied until his sister or some one else, went for the town marshal and another person, to look for the three men. The marshal and another came, examined the premises, and told Smith no body was there, and that if he was afraid to stay there, to go and stay all night with one of them. Smith accepted the invitation, and went and staid all night with a Mr. DeBord. Other witnesses, among them Col. W.G. Welch, a Mr. Myers and others, testified to acts of monomania, or insanity. The defense introduced two physicians, who had heard all, or nearly all of the evidence and after defining the various species of insanity, said that, if the evidence was true, as detailed by the witnesses, then in their opinion as medical men, the man, John Smith, was of unsound mind. Other witness said that in their opinion, Smith was insane. The foregoing are the main details of the evidence in the defense. After this, the Commonwealth introduced rebutting evidence to show that Smith was a sane man. These were not medical men, however, but were the men who had known Smith for years. Many of them said they believed Smith to be of sound mind, from conversations they had with him on certain occasions. One other physician testified for the prosecution, but his evidence differed but little from that of the other two physicians who testified at the instance of the defense. At the conclusion of the testimony for and against the prisoner, the court gave full instructions to the jury, and adjourned them at five o'clock Tuesday evening, until after supper. The sheriff kept them together until half past six, p. m., when they were called together and the argument was opened for the defense by J.W. Alcorn, Esq., in a forcible speech of about one hour. He was followed by Col. G.W. Dunlap for the prosecution in a speech of much power. He spoke over an hour and a quarter. After this, the jury were discharged until Wednesday morning, at 9 o'clock. At that hour, W.O. Hansford addressed the jury for the defense for over an hour. His speech was a feeling and good one. He was followed by Judge M.C. Saufley for the prosecution in a

somewhat lengthy speech, but it had a seemingly powerful effect upon the jury and the audience. Next and last came Col. T.P. Hill, for the defense, in one of the finest and ablest efforts he ever made in behalf of a criminal at our bar. His speech, nearly two hours long, was logical, beautiful, eloquent and convincing. The case was closed by Commonwealth Attorney George Denny. Mr. Denny, as a prosecutor, has but few equals in any district of the State. To say that he did justice to the Commonwealth, would be only a slight compliment. His effort in the prosecution was bold and telling, and showed him to be capable of attending to the public interest in the field to which he has been chosen. A number of ladies attended the speaking, and seemed to be much entertained. The case was given to the jury at 6 o'clock, and they retired and remained in their room for about two hours, without making a verdict. The Judge then adjourned them for the night, but called them together the next morning and they remained out until nearly noon. Being wholly unable to agree, they came in and so announced to the court, and they were therefore discharged. How they stood in the matter, no one yet knows, as they made a solemn vow among themselves not to let the public know. Smith, of course, was remanded to jail, where he will remain until the next term of this court in April, and all the long and tedious trial will have to be gone through with again. Four days and a part of two nights were spent in the investigation of the Smith case, which is quite one-third of the entire term."

From 'The Interior Journal' of Stanford, KY April 27, 1877: "CIRCUIT COURT NOTES"

"The greater portion of the time of the Court since our last report has been taken up in the trial of John Smith, who our readers will remember, shot and killed Judge J.E. Carson, at Crab Orchard on the 23rd day of April, 1876. This is the second trial of the case, and as it has created great excitement throughout the county, it was impossible to obtain but four jurors out of the regular panel, to-wit: Thomas Robinson, Liberty Green, Perry Land and P.L. Simpson, and the Court being satisfied that a full jury could not be obtained in the county, appointed Mr. T.T. Daviess a special Sheriff to go to Boyle county and summons sixty men. On Friday morning about forty men, in obedience to his summons appeared in Court, from which the additional following jurors were obtained: Jeff. Hudson, Wm. Calvert, Peter Bonia, Anthony May, Wm. Dibon, J.N. Prewitt, Samuel McDowell and Nick McDowell, and the panel having been completed the jury was sworn in. The taking of the testimony was commenced at noon Friday, and after the examination of some thirty or forty witnesses was concluded on Tuesday morning, when the charges to the jury having been agreed upon, the argument of the case was begun. The plea of the defendant was that he was at the time of the killing, and is now, insane. He was very ably defended, the speeches of some of his counsel being especially comprehensive and eloquent. Commonwealth Attorney George Denny, Jr., closed the argument on Wednesday about 10 o'clock, with one of his best and most forcible speeches, and the case was then given to the jury, who, after a short retirement returned the following verdict: "We, the jury, find the defendant, John Smith, guilty of murder and fix as his punishment, confinement in the Penitentiary during his natural life." The verdict appears to give almost unusual satisfaction as it will be easy enough to change Mr. Smith's residence from the Penitentiary to the Asylum if the officers at the former institution discover the much longed for insanity. Since the first trial of the case in October last, Smith has been confined for safe keeping in the jail at Louisville, and we are informed by the Clerk of the Court that his case has already cost the Commonwealth over \$2,000. It is to be hoped that it is at last ended."
