Specifically, the purpose of ECF is to support schools and consortia thereof in two main areas, internet bandwidth and connected devices, by covering the cost for eligible equipment and services between the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Any school or consortia of schools eligible for the FCC's E-Rate Program may request and receive support through ECF. Eligible equipment includes: Chromebook 4 and Chromebook Go.
