Clinton Could Sweep Northeast but RI, NJ, NH Are Tight; In Senate Races, Dems Leahy (VT) and Blumenthal (CT) Hold Big Leads; Ayotte Edging Hassan (NH) by 2

BOSTON, MA - In a series of Emerson College polls released today, spanning all six New England states and New Jersey, Hillary Clinton holds a lead over Donald Trump in all seven states. As Figure 1 shows, Clinton's advantage over Trump ranges from a high of 21 points in Vermont (47% to 26%) to a low of 3% in Rhode Island (44% to 41%). Libertarian candidate Gary Johnson is winning 14% of voters in New Hampshire, 13% in Vermont, 12% in Maine and under 10% in the other four states. The Green Party's Jill Stein has 7% of Vermont voters and 4% or less in the other six states.

Compared to President Obama's state-level margins of victory in the 2012 general election, Clinton's advantage is notably smaller in several states. Where Obama beat Mitt Romney in Massachusetts by 24 points, Clinton currently leads Trump by 17. Obama won Vermont by 36 points; she leads Trump by 21. She holds a slender 3-point edge in Rhode Island, which Obama won by 28 points.

In Maine, one of only two states that allocate its electoral votes by Congressional District rather than winner-take-all, Clinton is comfortably ahead of Trump, 52% to 30% in the First District. However, she trails him 41% to 32% in the more conservative Second District.

With three U.S. Senate seats up for grabs in the states polled, two incumbent Democrats are in a strong position to retain their seats while the only Republican incumbent on the ballot, New Hampshire's Kelly Ayotte, appears to be at some risk. Ayotte leads Democratic governor Maggie Hassan 48% to 46%, which is within the poll's margin of error. However, Hassan is viewed more

favorably than Ayotte, garnering a 52% to 41% (+11) favorable/unfavorable rating, compared to Ayotte's 44% to 48% (-4).

In Vermont, Senator Patrick Leahy is up 23 points over Republican challenger Scott Milne, 57% to 34%. Leahy, who was first elected to the Senate in 1974, remains popular with voters. His favorable/unfavorable ratio is 64% to 28% (+36). Milne's numbers are 29% to 33% (-4) with 34% of voters undecided about him.

In Connecticut's U.S. Senate race, Democratic incumbent Richard Blumenthal holds a wide lead over Republican state representative Dan Carter, 54% to 33%. Almost six out of 10 likely voters (57%) view Blumenthal favorably, and 34% have an unfavorable opinion of him. Voters are not familiar with Carter. His favorable/unfavorable ratio is 9% to 18% with 42% undecided about him and 30% who have never heard of him.

In the Northeast, both Clinton and Trump have issues within their respective parties, as illustrated in Figures 2 and 3. In all seven states, less than two-thirds of Bernie Sanders voters support Clinton, with Rhode Island showing the weakest support (50%) and Massachusetts and Connecticut the strongest (65% each). Trump and Gary Johnson seem to be the major beneficiaries of this trend. Trump is winning 24% of Sanders backers in Rhode Island and 18% in New Jersey. Johnson gets 15% in Maine and New Hampshire and 14% in Connecticut. Jill Stein picks up 14% in Sanders's home state of Vermont and 12% in Rhode Island, where only 50% of those who "felt the Bern" plan to vote for Clinton.

On the GOP side of the ballot, many Republicans who supported Ted Cruz, John Kasich, and Marco Rubio during the primaries have not come over to Trump's column. As Figure 3 shows, in six of the states polled, less than half of combined Cruz, Kasich and Rubio voters plan to vote for Trump in the general election; the exception is New Jersey, where 62% support the nominee. Gary Johnson is drawing a significant share of these disaffected primary voters: 33% in Vermont, 30% in New Hampshire, 26% in Rhode Island and 25% in Maine. Clinton pulls 25% in Massachusetts, 21% in Connecticut and 19% in New Hampshire and Rhode Island.

Independents are living up to their name. (See Figure 4.) In six of the seven states, 20% or more of Independents have not embraced either major-party candidate. In Vermont, 23% say they will vote for Johnson, 11% for Stein or 10% are unsure, a total of 44%. In New Hampshire, 16% of unaffiliated voters break for Johnson, 6% for Stein and 6% are unsure. Nonetheless, Clinton is winning a plurality of Independents in NH (38%), Connecticut (45%), Vermont (39%) and Maine (43%) while Trump leads the pack in Massachusetts (45%), New Jersey (45%) and Rhode Island (48%).




Figure 5: The Candidates' Favorability Deficits

Consistent with other ECPS polls, both Trump and Clinton are both viewed unfavorably, although voters' opinions of Trump are more negative, as reflected in Figure 5. His favorability deficit is highest in Vermont (-54) and lowest in New Jersey (-15).

While Clinton fares better, she too is disliked by Northeast voters. She does worst in New Hampshire, where her favorable/unfavorable differential is -22. She fares best in Connecticut, where she rates 48% in both the favorable and unfavorable categories. See Figure 6 below.

The Caller IDs for the seven state polls are as follows:

- The Emerson College New Jersey poll was conducted September 2-5. The sample consisted of 800 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 3.4%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, age, and congressional district.
- The Maine poll was conducted September 2-5. The sample consisted of 800 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 3.4%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, party affiliation, age, gender and congressional district.
- The Rhode Island poll was conducted September 2-5. The sample consisted of 800 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 3.4%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, party affiliation, age, gender and congressional district.
- The New Hampshire poll was conducted September 3-5. The sample consisted of 600 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 3.9%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, party affiliation, age and gender.
- The Connecticut poll was conducted September 2-5. The sample consisted of 1,000 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 3%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, party affiliation, age and gender.
- The Vermont poll was conducted September 2-5. The sample consisted of 600 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 3.9%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, party affiliation, age and gender.
- The Massachusetts poll was conducted September 3-5. The sample consisted of 500 likely general election voters with a margin of error of +/- 4.3%. Data was weighted by 2012 election results, party affiliation, age, gender and congressional district.

It is important to remember that subsets based on gender, age and party breakdowns carry with them higher margins of error, as the sample size is reduced. Data was collected using an Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system of landlines only. The full methodology and results can be found at www.theecps.com.
