Conjunctival lymphoma

Category(ies): Cornea, External Disease

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Conjunctival lymphoma classically appears as a smooth, mobile, salmon-colored, fleshy mass. The lesions are most commonly unilateral. They cannot be differentiated from <u>benign lymphoid hyperplasia</u> based on clinical appearance alone, and thus require biopsy. This lesion was biopsied and found to be an extranodal marginal zone (MALT) B-cell lymphoma.


