Frequently asked questions

How can I apply to an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree?

The list of all Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees (EMJMDs) is available on the <u>EMJMD Catalogue</u> and <u>the EU Delagation to Rwanda website</u>. Go to the website of the EMJMD you are interested in. Check the conditions for scholarship application. Bear in mind that every EMJMD has its own requirements, selection criteria and application procedure! If you need more information, ask directly the EMJMD Coordinator: their contact details or a contact form are on the EMJMD website. You can then apply directly to the EMJMD on their website.

Which Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees are available?

The list of all Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees (EMJMDs) is available on the EMJMD Catalogue and the EU Delagation to Rwanda website. Go to the website of the EMJMD you are interested in. Can I apply for an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree before I graduate?

For most EMJMD programmes you can apply when you are in your final year of studies and even though you have not graduated yet. You will have to send in all other necessary documents as well as your most recent transcripts before the application deadline. Make sure to contact the EMJMD Coordinator of the programme you are applying to, to let them know of your situation. If you expect to graduate before the start of the EMJMD, the Coordinator may evaluate your application and make a conditional offer pending completion of your degree. Nevertheless, bear in mind that every EMJMD is solely responsible for determining its application and selection procedure.

What are the deadlines for the Eramus Mundus Joint Master Degree Programme?

There are over a 100 different Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree Programmes and all have their own application deadlines. It is thus crucial to thoroughly check the application deadlines and requirement of the programme you want to apply to. How are students selected for an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree?

Students are selected by the individual EMJMDs, which have their own selection procedures. The application process, the deadlines and the entrance criteria may vary from one course to another. You will find further information about the specific selection procedure and the requirements of each EMJMD on their website.

How can I obtain my visa to study in an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree?

The Coordinator of the course you will study will provide you with guidance and support when applying for a visa. However, you are entirely responsible for completing your visa request and for obtaining it before the start of your studies. As the procedure can be time-consuming and differs from one country to another, it is best to start applying the soonest possible.

When will I get the final results of my Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree scholarship application? Since all the EMJMD have their own application deadlines the selection schedules also vary across the programmes. The EMJMD course you have applied for is responsible for selecting the students and announcing the results to the candidates.

Therefore, if you want to know more about the status of your application, contact directly the Coordinator(s) of the EMJMD(s) you have applied for.

Where can I find sources of funding for my studies?

The Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree offers full scholarships with monthly allowances. The application deadlines for scholarships are often sooner than the deadlines for self-funded students.
