About the Conference

The 32nd Annual Conference of HEA on "Indian Economy During Pandemic: New Challenges and Opportunities" is being organized by the Department of Economics, Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University (CRSU), Jind in collaboration with the Haryana Economic Association. This collaboration would raise the academic standard of the conference and will go a long way in strengthening and will also be helpful in providing academic expression to the students, research scholars, teachers and academicians. This conference is based on three main themes i.e. Impact of COVID 19 on Indian Economy, Crisis in Economic Theory and Emerging Scenario of Haryana Economy.

The impact of the coronavirus pandemic on India has been largely disruptive in terms of economic activities. Almost all the sectors have been adversely affected as domestic demand and exports sharply plummeted with some notable exceptions where high growth was observed. Apart from these, the labour issues, informal sector and gender aspects of Covid-19 are also being discussed in academia at length. Now, there are some emerging issues in our economy which are very important such as effects of economic policies on employment, new dimensions of the rural and agricultural economy, changing economic order at the global level due to the increasing impact of developing economies, emerging issues and opportunities in financial sector etc. which need focussed attention so that appropriate policy alternative can be framed.

The prolonged world economic crisis has exposed the inadequacy of classroom mainstream economics. It has effectively become irrelevant to understanding real-world problems. The irrelevance of the dominant paradigm (neoclassical) in mainstream economics is well evident from the recurring reaction of students and young researchers around the world, (after the 2008 financial crisis) against the theories, models and ways in which economics is taught at top universities of the world. It has resulted in a movement within academia to challenge the dominant paradigm of mainstream economics (i.e., neoclassical) with an objective to develop an alternative paradigm to understand real-world issues. However, such a movement is almost absent in the academia of developing countries and India is no exception.

Haryana is a state of potential where the economy is in the transitional phase. Haryana's structural transformation from an agrarian state to an industrial state, with the service sector recording robust growth with new areas of business, are emerging. The developmental aspects of the state economy have shown progressive development towards achieving sustainable development goals. The economy of Haryana is also adversely affected due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Through the academic discourse in this conference, these emerging issues along with contemporary challenges like unemployment problem, increase indebtedness in agriculture, stress in informal sector, budget deficit in the economy of Haryana will be deliberated.

Research papers are invited on the various themes of the conference. The word limit for abstract and full paper is 250 and 3000 words respectively. Selected papers will be published in upcoming issues of the 'Kautilya- Haryana Economic Journal'.
