


# Power





## **Electrical Generation**

- Pre-War 4,400 Megawatts (MW)
- 05 Oct 03 4,417 MW (Met initial goal of 4,400 MW)
- 01 Jun 04 6,000 MW (Estimated summer 2003 peak demand)
- Ambassador Bremer approved a new power increase plan on 14 Jan to prevent current project delays from impacting the goal of 6,000 MW by 01 Jun
- CPA Autumn Maintenance Program began Oct 03 and continues with about 874 MW currently in scheduled maintenance



# Education

## **Current Activities**

- Ministry of Education (MoE) held workshop for provincial Directors General and training department heads to discuss future operations of the Training Institute
- Accelerated Learning Program students finished weeklong mid-year examinations with high attendance rates (97% across Iraq)
  - Provides out-of-school children a second chance for education
  - Children who pass year-end exams will be integrated into main schools
- More than 1,500 Iraqi secondary students for a student-exchange program sponsored by the State Department's YES Program
  - 12 students will attend high school in the United
     States and live with a local family

# Health Care

- Ministry of Health (MOH) focus shifting from curative-based model to primary healthcare clinic model
- MOH testing a rapid-response disease surveillance system
  - Will enable health care workers to track disease paths and protect other people from becoming infected
- Hospital / clinic operating budgets increased from \$24M in FY03 to \$40.5M in FYO4
- 240 hospitals and 1200 primary health clinics offer basic health care services
- 600 primary healthcare clinics in Iraq will receive state-of- the-art medical equipment, basic clinical supplies and training
- Two recent grants provided for 300 protective x-ray suits to be given to hospitals in mid-March

#### **Milestones**


- Apr 04: Electronic health surveillance program initiated
- Jun 04: Model health care clinics established emphasizing prevention and disease management
- End 04: 90% of all children receive routine immunizations
- End 05: Infant mortality rate reduced by half to 50 / 1,000

# **Economics**

## **Financial Markets**

- As of Jan 30, estimated crude oil export revenue is \$1.2 billion
- The World Trade Organization (WTO) placed Iraq's request for observer status on the agenda for the February 11 WTO General Council session
- Baghdad stock exchange market will be open in late February

## **Currency and Banking**

- Currency exchange completed
  - Over the last week the exchange rate of the new Iraqi dinar (NID)
     against the US dollar has stabilized in a tight range from 1360-1400 NID
     per dollar
  - The foreign currency reserves held in currency notes at the Central Bank of Iraq have risen to \$1.5 billion, excluding Development F und for Iraq (DFI) balances

## **Other Developments**

- Coalition Joint Task Force 7 (CJTF-7) Civil Affairs units estimate that CPA has directly created approximately 393,950 jobs for Iraqi Citizens (46.3 percent complete, based on a target of 850,000)
- The National Employment Program has created over 76,000 jobs
