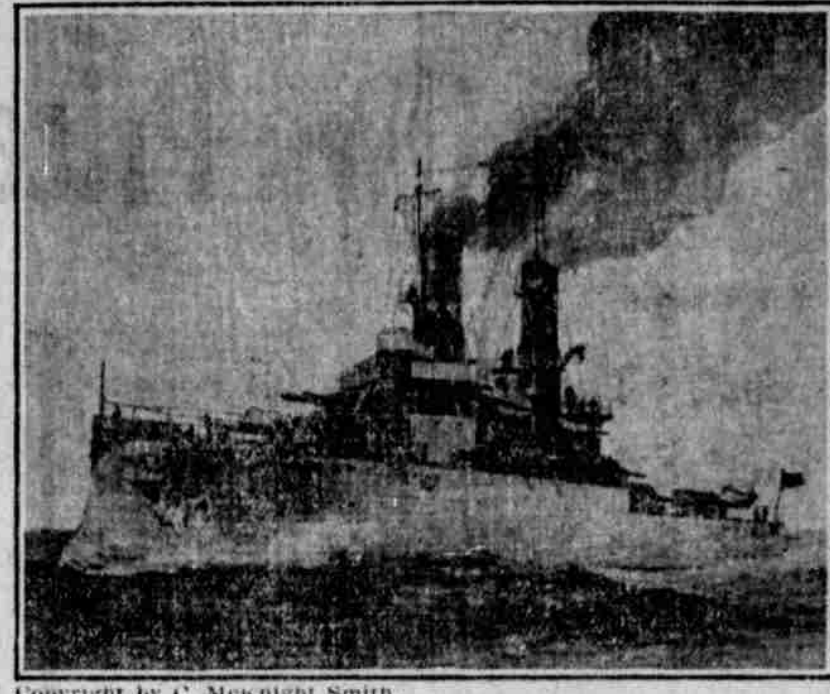


Majestic Walking Cake

THE GIANT BATTLESHIP DELAWARE.

A race is in progress for the completion of the first of the 20,000-ton Dreadnoughts of the American navy, the battleships Delaware and North Dakota. The Newport News Shipbuilding and Drydock company is building the Delaware, and the Fore River company of Quincy, Mass., has the contract for the other vessel. These ships will be far more powerful than any others in the navy and will rival their monster prototype, which is the boast of the British navy.

MORE CARS IDLE NOW THAN EVER BEFORE

NEW YORK, April 30.—A shrinkage of half in the volume of business on the stock market today from that of yesterday was significant of the abatement of the demand for stocks. One of the more active factors and most important in the rapid accumulation of idle freight cars reported by the American railways association's committee.

The number of these idle cars on April 15, was 375,770, pronounced the greatest total in the history of American railroading, having risen from 297,042 on March 15 last, when the increased freight movement had been bringing additional cars into service. The statement of the March earnings of the Harriman roads gave signal evidence of effective measures of economy being put in force.

NEW YORK, April 30.—Copper was lower in London, with spot £57.10, and futures £57.25, 6d. Locally dull and unchanged, with lake 12.62 1/2 to 12.87 1/2, electrolytic 12.20 to 12.75, casting 12.23 to 12.50. Lead 5 1/2 higher at £13.50 in London. Local market was firm; no further change being reported, quotations ranging from 4.05 to 4.10. Selter was unchanged at 4.80 to 4.65. Iron was lower on the English market. Local market unsettled.

HER HEART IS SEWED UP

California Woman Lives After Doctors Perform Operation.

BAKERSFIELD, April 30.—Mrs. Sophia Miller of Bakersfield, who attempted to commit suicide by shooting herself through the heart and lungs, begins her fifteenth day at the hospital this morning in the fight which her surgeons are making for her life, with every prospect that she will recover.

When Mrs. Miller shot herself there seemed but little prospect that she would live. The bullet plowed its way through her breast, cutting the pericardium and puncturing the lungs three times and then passed out through the small of the back near the spinal column. Her chances for life were considered nil by the doctors, but they determined on a desperate operation to try to save her life.

The fifth, sixth and seventh ribs were cut and the heart lifted from the body. While one doctor held the throbbing organ in his hands another sewed up the gash in the pericardium, and the heart was still held out of its position while Dr. Garrett cleaned the three gaping wounds in the lungs. The heart was then replaced and the external organs sewed up.

If Mrs. Miller recovers—and Dr. Cook stated her chances for life were more than good—it will be one of the most notable cases in medical history.
