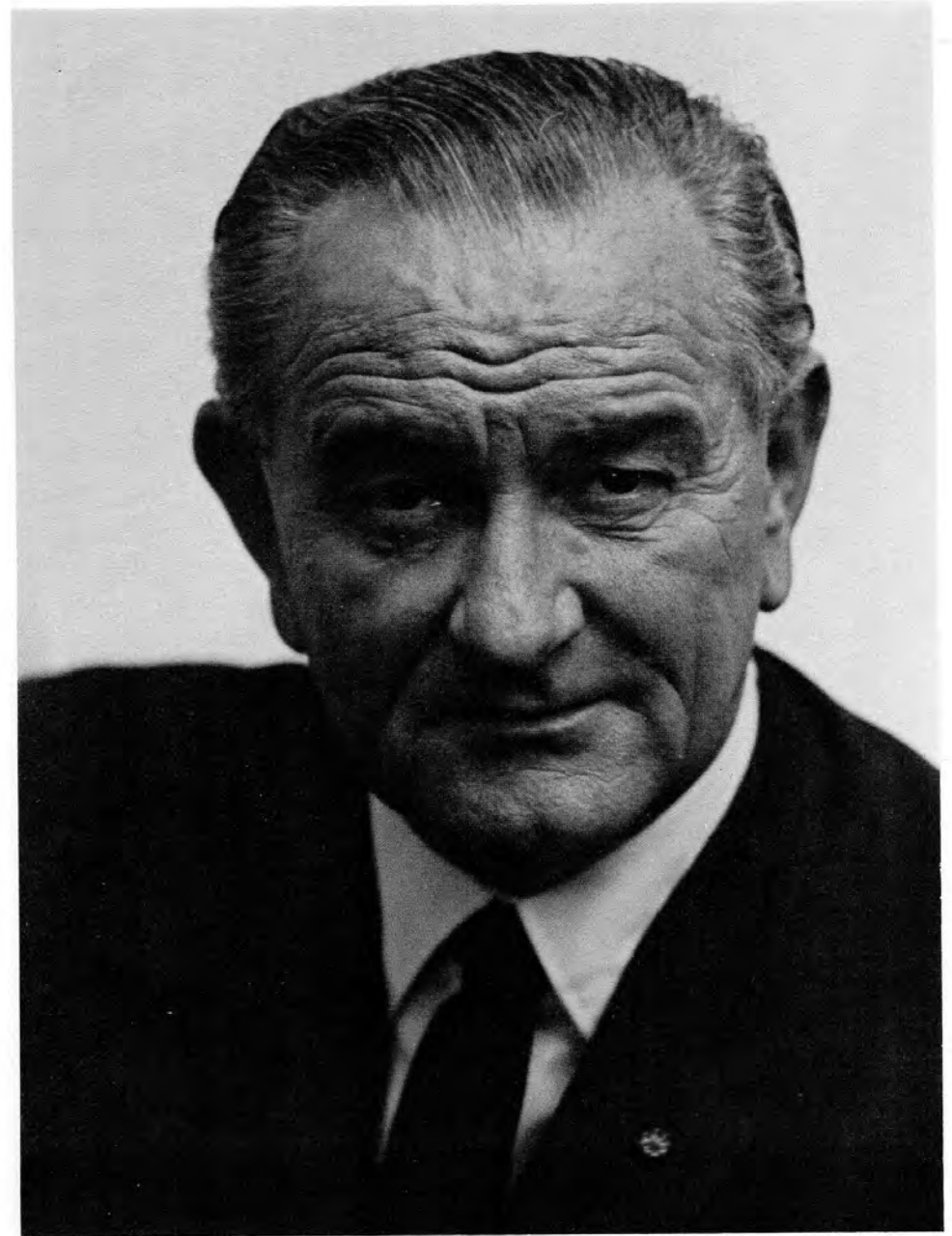

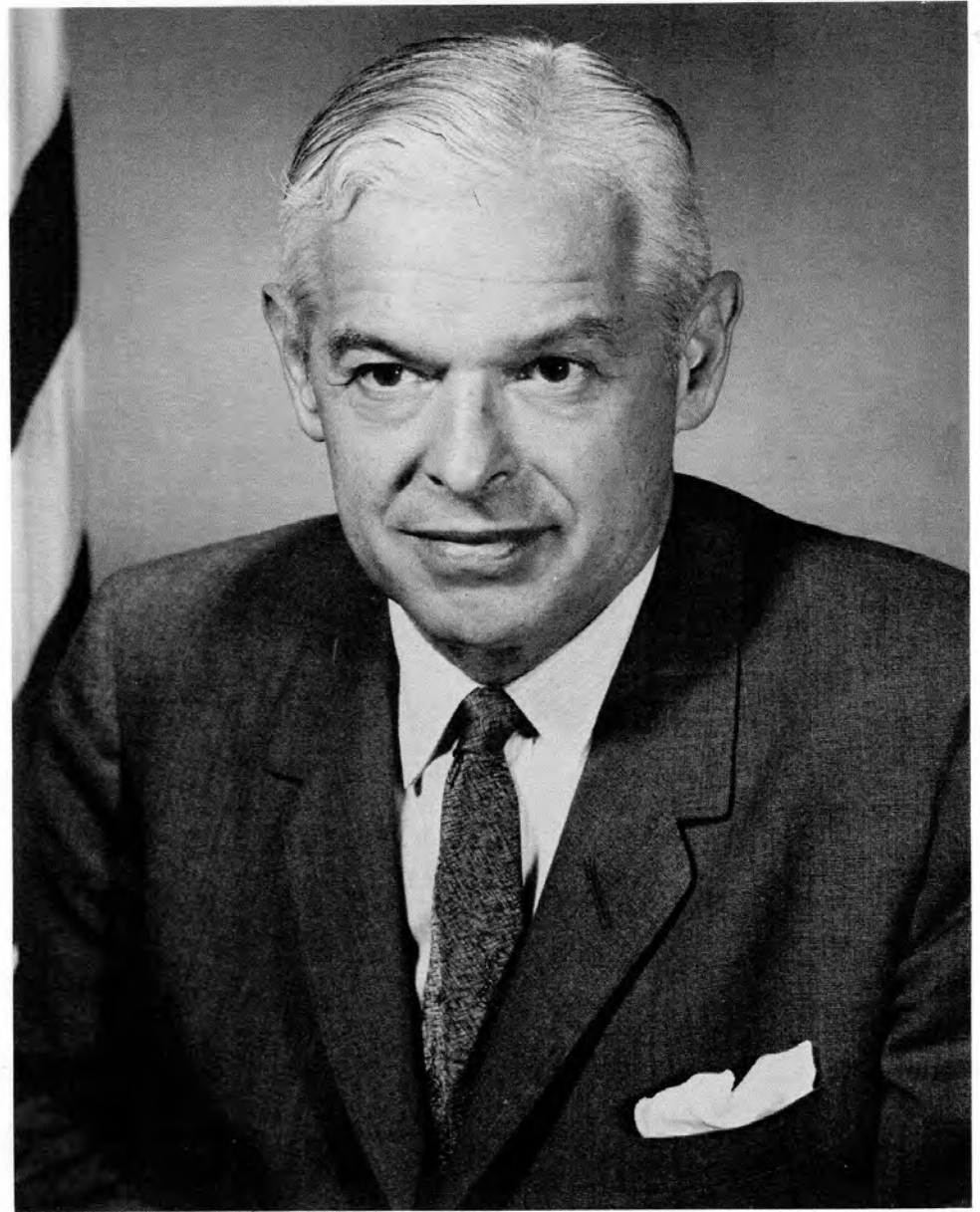



FIREPOWER FOR FREEDOM

"Firepower for Freedom" is the motto of the battleship New Jersey.

The second ship of the line to bear the name New Jersey today enters the fleet for the third time, carrying on a proud heritage of service to country, and to the cause of freedom.

The big guns of the New Jersey (9-16"/50 caliber plus 20-5"/38 caliber naval rifles) are in the battleship tradition. Capable of delivering a 2700 pound projectile a distance of 23 miles, the New Jersey is suited to the several tasks at hand, from shore bombardment to direct artillery support for allied troops.

Originally commissioned on 23 May 1943, New Jersey reported for fleet duty in the Pacific shortly thereafter. Armored with a 17-inch steel belt, and designed for action, the ship subsequently participated in the Battles of the Philippine Sea and of Leyte Gulf, and fought to secure the Marshall Islands, Western Guinea, the Marianas, the Carolines, Luzon, Iwo Jima, and Okinawa. By time victory in the Pacific had been achieved, New Jersey had earned nine battle stars.

The Korean Conflict was the scene of New Jersey's next call to action. Winning four additional battle stars, the ship bombarded enemy installations and troop concentrations throughout the Korean peninsula in support of United Nations forces.

Since 21 August 1957, New Jersey has been part of the Inactive Fleet awaiting the day when a battleship would once again be needed to fight in defense of freedom.

Today's New Jersey is more streamlined, more habitable, more modern than ever before. New gunfire control computers, radar, and communications equipment have been installed; a helicopter platform is now part of the ship's fantail, and all of the living spaces have been air-conditioned.

887 feet in length, New Jersey is 108 feet wide at its beam, and has a draft of 38 feet. Four steam turbines, which generate 212,000 horsepower, can propel the 54,000 ton ship at speeds up to 33 knots.

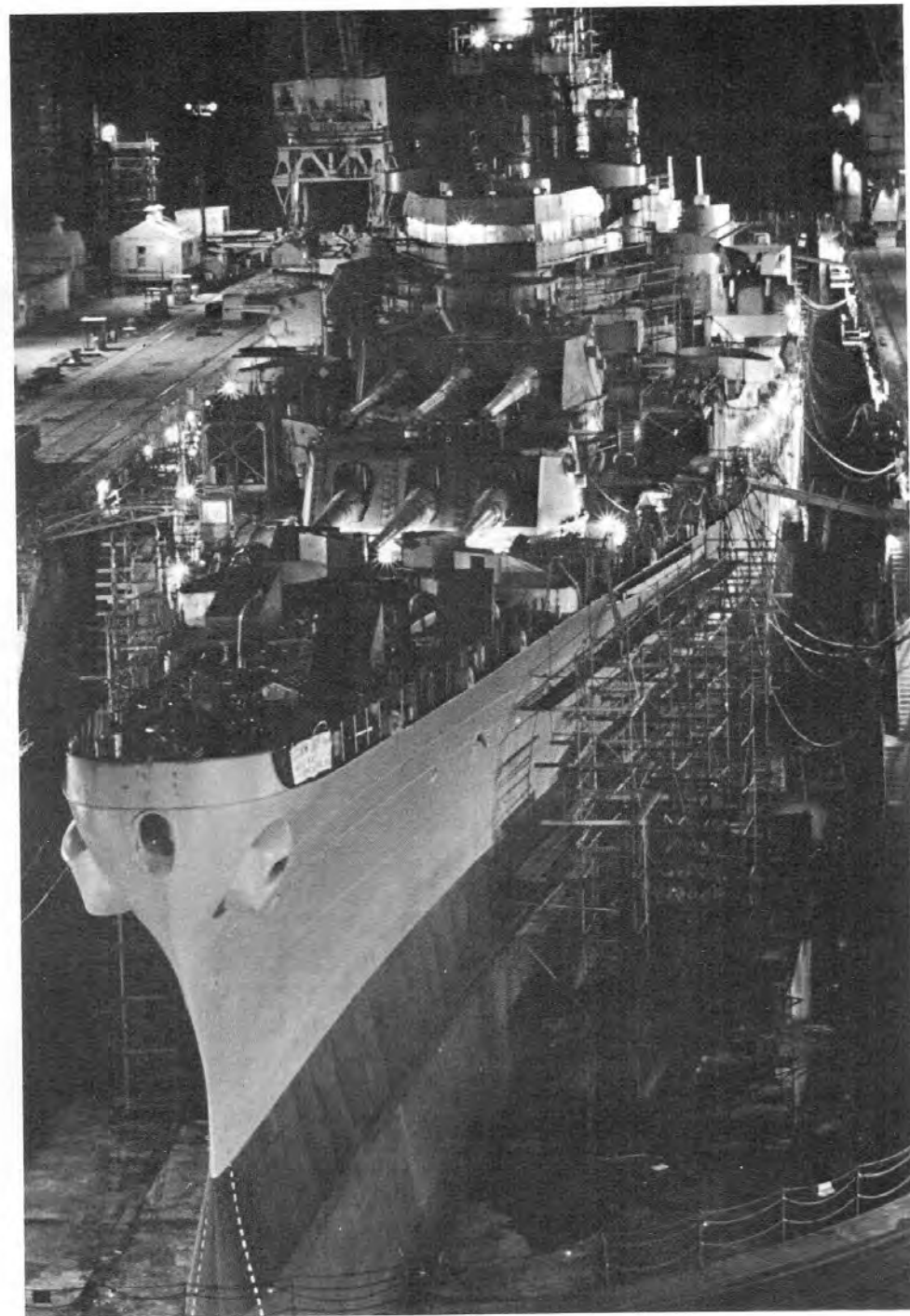

REMARKS BY THE COMMANDING OFFICER

CAPTAIN J. EDWARD SNYDER, JR., U. S. Navy



COMMANDING OFFICER

Captain Snyder will be serving in his ninth Navy ship when he takes USS NEW JERSEY to sea in April after its recommissioning as the only battleship in service in the world.

Captain Snyder's career dates back to 1944 when he graduated 64th in his class of 914 at the U. S. Naval Academy. NEW JERSEY is the third ship which he has commanded.

While his sea duty includes assignments aboard cruisers and destroyers, it all started on a battleship more than 23 years ago. From Annapolis, he reported directly to USS PENNSYLVANIA as Signal Officer, and participated in various World War II actions including Leyte, Suriago Strait, Lingayen Gulf, Luzon, and at Buckner Bay in Okinawa. From PENNSYLVANIA, he had successive tours aboard heavy cruisers USS TOLEDO and USS MACON as Main-Battery Assistant.

Captain Snyder served in five destroyers. He was Gunnery Officer of the USS HOLDER, Executive Officer of the USS EVERETT F. LARSON and USS HEERMANN, and Commanding Officer of the USS CALCATERRA (17 months) and USS BROWNSON (25 months).

Between assignments at sea, Captain Snyder had several tours directly involved with the Navy's special weapons projects. He spent 2½ years as a nuclear supervisor at Las Alamos (N. Mex.) Scientific Laboratory, and two years as Polaris Missile Re-Entry Systems Officer with the Lockheed Corporation in Sunnyvale, California. He attended the Naval Postgraduate School (1952), obtained a Master's Degree in Nuclear Physics at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (1955), and graduated from the Naval War College (1961).

Captain Snyder's previous assignment was as Special Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Research and Development). A specialist in oceanography and underwater engineering, he originated several technical publications on this subject, and, in 1967, received the Legion of Merit for major contributions to the Navy and to the National Oceanographic Program.

In addition to the Legion of Merit, Captain Snyder received the Secretary of the Navy Unit Commendation while serving in USS PENNSYLVANIA, the Secretary of the Navy Certificate of Commendation for his work with Polaris Missile Re-Entry Systems, and in 1967, the Navy League's Annual Rear Admiral W. S. Parsons Award for Scientific and Technical Progress.

Captain Snyder was born October 23, 1924, in Grand Forks, N. D., the son of a Methodist minister. He attended high school in Baltimore prior to entering the Naval Academy. He is married to the former Mary Louise Dize, of Crisfield, Md., and they have two children; a son, Joseph Edward Snyder, III, 22, a recent graduate of M. I. T., and a daughter, Anne Gibson Snyder, 18, a freshman at Mary Washington College in Fredericksburg, Va. The family temporarily resides in Fairfax, Va.

James Sidle Elfelt was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, on December 28, 1929, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. D. Elfelt, and resided there until his graduation from the University of Minnesota in 1951. At that time he received his commission in the United States Navy.

Following commissioning he served three and a half years in Atlantic Fleet destroyers prior to reporting for duty as Commanding Officer of USS WARBLER, a minesweeper homeported in Sasebo, Japan. Shore duty in Washington, D. C. was followed by postgraduate work at Stanford University. His next sea tour included two years as Missile Officer of the heavy cruiser USS HELENA and two years in USS PRESTON as Executive Officer. Duty in PRESTON was followed by two years in the Officer Distribution Division of the Bureau of Naval Personnel.

From August 1965 until June 1966 he was a student at the Naval War College. Upon graduation, he reported as Commanding Officer of the destroyer USS HENDERSON. In November 1967 he was ordered to the Fleet Training Center, Naval Station, San Diego, California for duty as Prospective Executive Officer in connection with the re-commissioning of the USS NEW JERSEY (BB-62).

Commander Elfelt holds Masters Degrees from Stanford and George Washington Universities.

He is married to the former Sally Dahm of St. Davids, Pennsylvania, and they have four children, Elizabeth, Helen, James, and Cordelia, residing in Los Alamitos, California.
