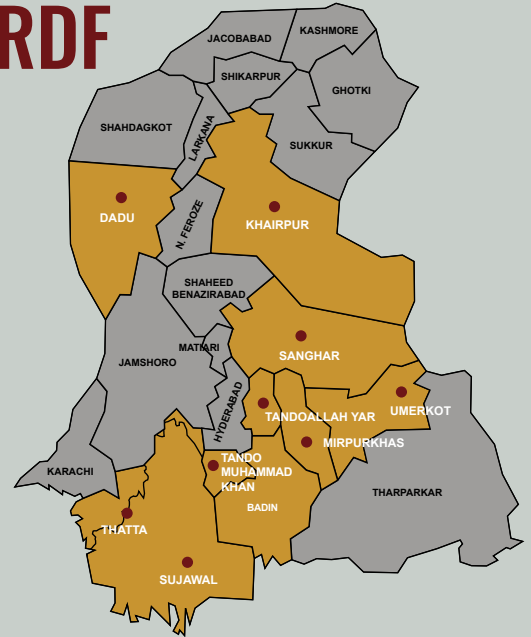


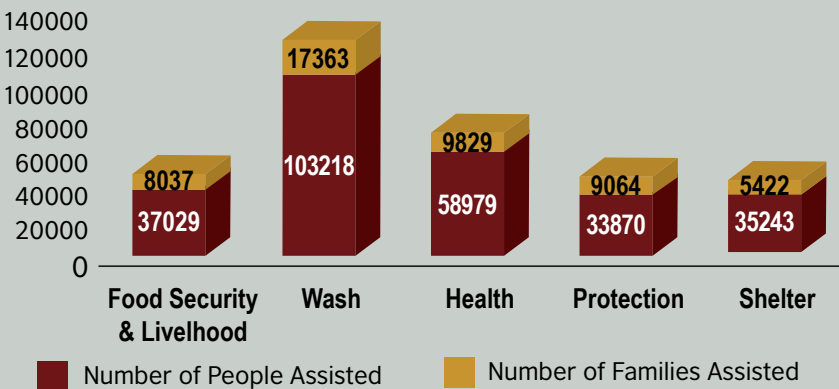
Flood 2022 and Response of RDF

The recent monsoon spell that started in the second week of July 2022 caused widespread flooding and it led to extensive human and infrastructure damage across many parts of Pakistan. According to the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), around 33 million people were affected.

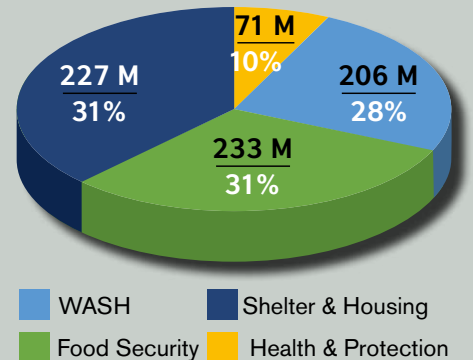
RDF, being a responsible citizens organization started response from day one of the flood disaster 2022, together with its partners & philanthropists. It extended its relief operations in Dadu, Khairpur, Sanghar, Mirpurkhas, Badin, Tando Allahyar, Sujawal and Tando Muhammad Khan in Sindh province and Lasbella in Balochistan and supported **49,725 families (268,339 individuals)** through different activities under food security and livelihood, shelter, WASH, health and protection sectors.

Flood Response Portfolio in PKR Millions

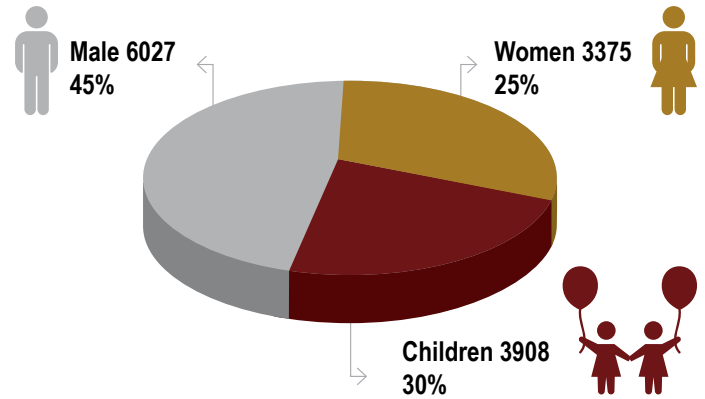


Food Security & Livelihood



Responding to the food insecurity, malnutrition situation in affected areas, RDF started distribution of dry ration for one month's period among the **4195** poor families, benefiting **6027** men, **3375** women and **3908** children and secure their food intake for buffer period. RDF teams also provided cooked food to more than **50,000** people in camps.

Multi-purpose Cash Assistance and Cash for Work to Vulnerable Families

Multipurpose cash assistance (MPCA) and cash for work was provided to around **6,500** families (**45,200** individuals) to make them able to manage crucial routine expenditures of their families as well as rehabilitate infrastructure or livelihood resources. An amount of PKR. **15000** per family was provided through banking channels. Around **200** families rehabilitated their livestock sheds with the cash grants.



Distribution of Nutrition Supplement Items for Children

RDF with the support of philanthropists, distributed nutrition supplement items to more than **3000** children. The supplement items included milk pack, chocolate, energy biscuits, juices, dates etc.



Distribution of Seed, Fertilizer and WANDA Feed for Livestock

Due to flooding, major Kharif crops – rice, cotton, and sugarcane – were lost **80%**, **88%**, and **61%** respectively. These three crops faced a direct loss of USD **1.30** billion. Bananas, lemons, onions, Chilies, tomatoes, and other *kharif* vegetables were either fully damaged or suffered severe losses. Three key vegetable crops – tomato, onion, and Chilies – faced the loss of USD **374** million in affected districts. Around **42,174** livestock heads died in floods, causing the direct loss of around USD **13** million to livestock in the province¹.

Responding to this worst situation, RDF supported **3,842** small farming families (**23,719** individuals) in Sujawal and Dadu district by providing them the wheat seed, fertilizer for

Rabi season and distributed Wanda feed for livestock. Vaccination drives were carried out together with the Livestock Department Govt of Sindh to reduce mortality and disease outbreaks.

Livestock Vaccination Drive

RDF with the assistance of Livestock Department Government of Sindh, vaccinated more than **65000** livestock in various affected villages and organised spontaneous camps in Sindh to prevent diseases outbreak.



Emergency WASH Assistance

WASH was one of the major emergency relief intervention of RDF's Relief Operations, in order to protect affected communities against water borne diseases.



RDF extended its WASH assistance to around **17363 families (103218 individuals)** through provision of:



Safer water provision through water tanker services and installation of Mega Water Treatment Plants



Distribution of Hygiene Kits and Jerry cans, water coolers



Installation of emergency ventilated pit latrines



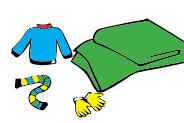
Rehabilitation of water facilities

Distribution of camp cleaning material and kits, debris removal activities



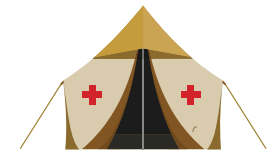

Emergency Health Assistance

RDF teams started establishing medical camps in district Dadu, Badin, Khairpur, Tando Allahyar, Tando Muhammad Khan and Mirpurkhas during first four months of the flood disaster, to provide emergency medical assistance to **58979** flood affected individuals.

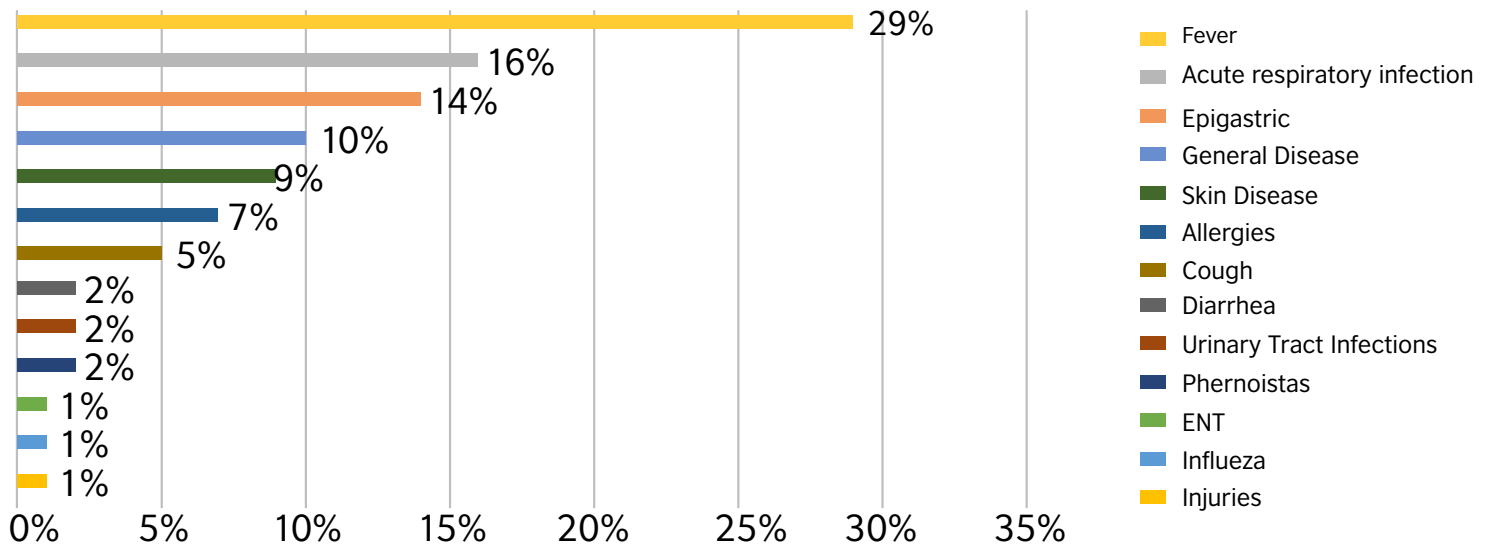

Disease trend during Flood 2022



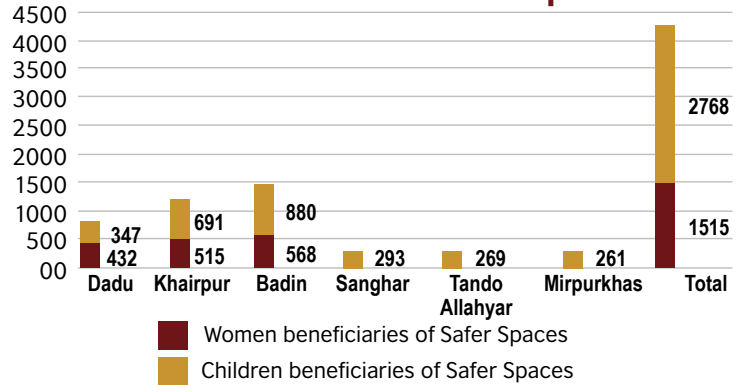
Protection

To protect vulnerable groups, RDF established safer spaces in district Dadu, Khairpur and Badin districts, to reduce risk of discrimination and/or abuse, especially to vulnerable groups such as children, women, older people and those with existing disabilities or chronic health conditions, as well as to extend to them the psychosocial assistance. A total of **9074** families (**33870** individuals) were benefited through engagement in productive learning activities at the safer spaces, provision of dignitary kits and solar lights to women, formation of referral pathways and engaging children in playful activities during their makeshift stay.

Emergency Shelter Assistance

RDF provided temporary shelter kits to **5422** affected families (**35243** individuals) who were living in makeshift camps, on the roadsides under open skies. Government established camps, but there were thousands of families who were living in open spaces without any shelter. RDF temporary shelter kits included the tarpaulin sheets, bamboos, rope, floor mat and water cooler. After the flood emergency period of three months (August-October 2022), RDF also designed and installed resilient shelters (both the Permanent and semi permanent designs) in Badin, Dadu, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar and Tando Allahyar.
