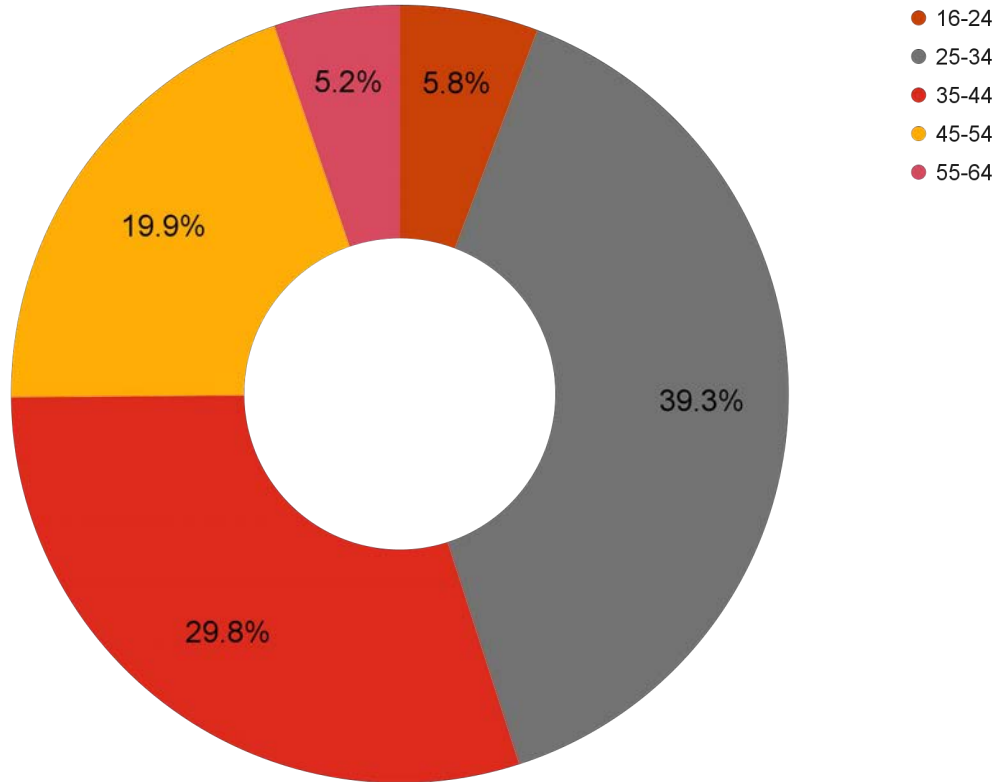

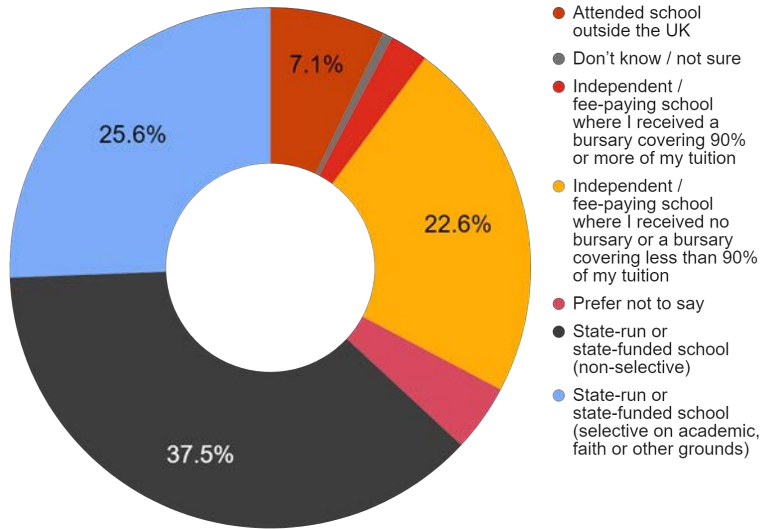
Age Distribution

Age distribution shown as a percentage across all individuals

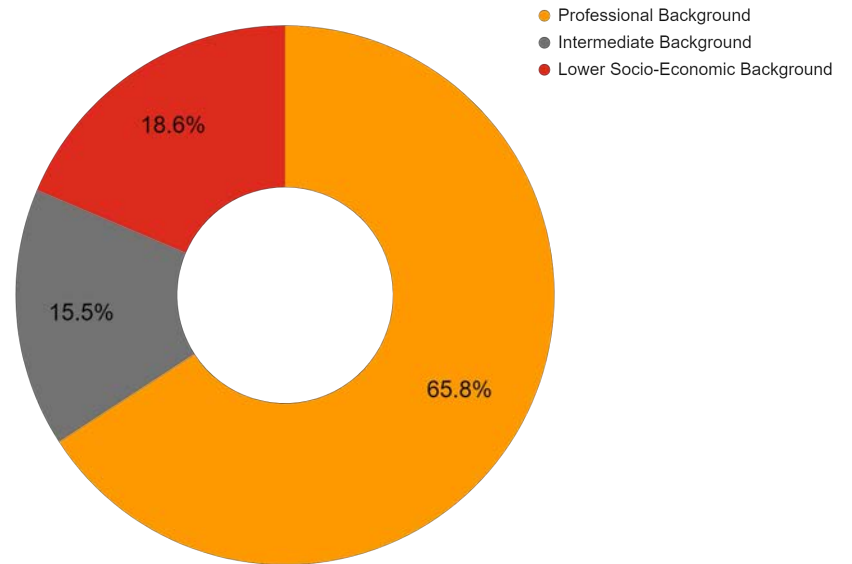


Socio Economic Background

Parental occupation at age 14

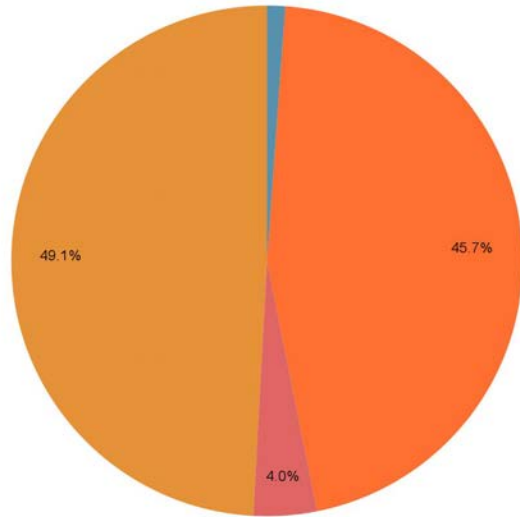


Type of school employee attended between ages of 11 and 16

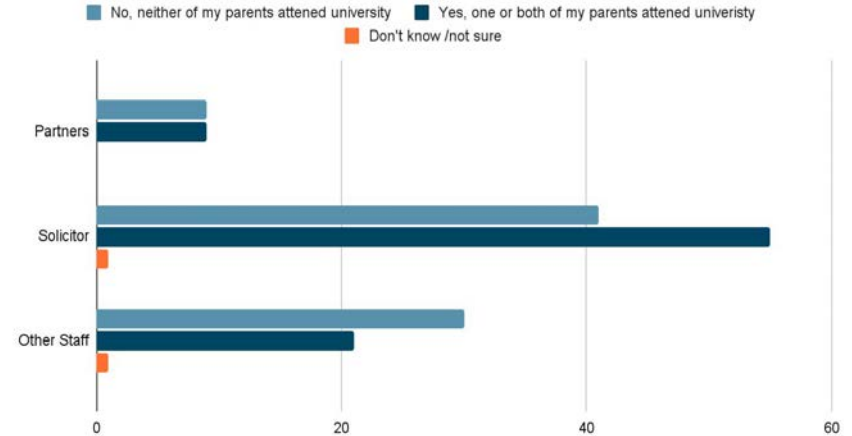


Socio Economic Background

Data shows how many individual's parents attended university and gained a degree by the time they were 18 and is shown as a percentage and broken down by 3 role categories (shown in numbers)

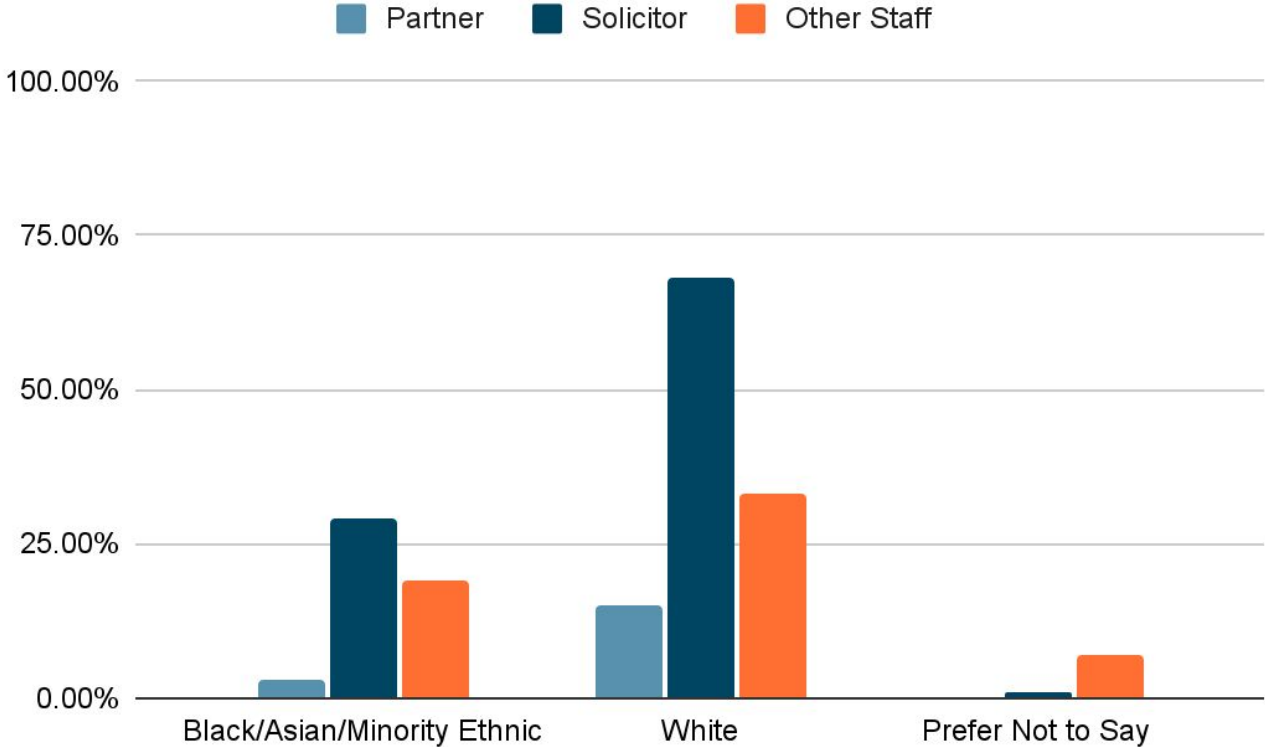
